Modi government healed wounds given by Congress party, stated BJP National Secretary Manjinder Singh Sirsa, while he addressed a Press Conference at BJP Headquarters, Jammu.

Sirsa was accompanied by BJP J&K Vice-President Assem Gupta, former MLCS Vikram Randhawa & Charanjit Singh Khalsa, Minority Morcha President and other party leaders during the Press Conference.
