around 60,924 artisans were trained till date through 70 government and 152 (NSDC approved) private training centers. It was said that after giving the basic skill these would be provided advanced skills besides a certificate of their skilling to receive the necessary assistance and toolkit.

As far as the implementation of RAMP scheme is concerned the MD, TPO, Khalid Jahangir apprised the meeting about the aims and objectives of this scheme. He said that 461 and 420 consultations with stake holders had been done across the districts of J&K.

It was also revealed that the baseline survey of about 1835 Udhyam and 1434 non-Udhyam registered MSMEs were surveyed by the organization here. It was given out that there are some 3.9 lakh micro, 0.49 lakh small and 290 medium enterprises here in the UT.

BIS conducts 3-day training program for Mentors, Teachers & Resource Persons at SKICC Srinagar

SRINAGAR, APR 25: Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), National Standards Body of India, has introduced a new initiative called "Learning Science via Standards" aimed at enhancing students' understanding of scientific concepts through practical applications in manufacturing, functioning and quality testing of various products as per relevant Indian Standards. This initiative is a continuation of BIS's earlier efforts to establish Standards Clubs in educational institutions across India

To date, over 10,000 such clubs have been established, boasting a membership of more than three lakh students across the country. Notably, in the Kashmir Valley alone, around 175 standard clubs have been set up, engaging over 3,500 students. To conduct the activities of these clubs, over 5,000 science teachers have been trained as mentors nationwide.

As part of the "Learning Science via Standards" series and to train the mentors of standard club, science teachers and Resource Person, threeday training was organised by, Jammu and Kashmir Branch office of Bureau of Indian Standards from April 23 to April 25, 2024, at SKICC, Srinagar.
