Injustice to Karnataka in tax devolution, will fight it out: DK Shivakumar

BENGALURU, OCT 12: Alleging that the Centre has done injustice by al-

locating less funds to Karnataka in the tax devolution, Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar on Saturday said that the Congress government in the state would fight it out.

Shivakumar, also the state Congress chief, attacked BJP MPs and union ministers from the state for remaining silent on the issue and termed it "shameful." "Injustice has happened to Karnataka. They have given more to Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. We were given less than even Andhra Pradesh, which doesn't contribute much in tax. We will fight and protest this in the days ahead," Shivakumar said.

Speaking to reporters here, he said, "We will formulate a programme to fight for - our tax, our

The union government on Thursday released tax devolution of Rs 1,78,173 crore to the state governments, including one advance instalment of Rs 89,086.50 crore in addition to the regular instalment due for October 2024.

Justice Anish Kumar Gupta dismissed the case against Pranjal Shukla and two others, finding that the evidence presented in the FIR and witness statements did not support the claims of dowry harass-

primary allegations centred around disagreements related to the couple's sexual relationship and the wife's refusal to engage in certain activities. It concluded that these disputes were not indicative of dowry demands and were more likely driven by personal differences.

"It is apparent that the dispute is with regard to the sexual incompatibility of the parties for which the dispute was there between the parties and due to the said dispute the instant FIR

The court noted that the posite party making out the the court found that these talse and concocted allegations with regard to the demand of dowry," the court stated.

"If a man were to demand sexual favors from his own wife and vice versa, where would they go to satisfy their physical sexual urges in a morally civilized society?" the court questioned.

The FIR had accused Shukla of demanding dowry and engaging in abusive behaviour, including forcing his wife to watch porn and engage in allegations were not sup ported by credible evidence.

As per fact of the case, Meesha Shukla got married to the applicant Pranjal Shukla on December 07, 2015, as per Hindu rites and customs. An FIR was lodged by Meesha alleging demand of dowry by her inlaws namely Madhu Sharma and Punya Sheel Sharma. However, it has been categorically stated in the FIR that prior to marriage there was no demand of money.
