Speaking on the occasion, Billawaria said that a lot of things came to light during the meeting with the Municipal Corporation Commissioner.

He urged the Commissioner to take immediate action to provide relief to the citizens. During the meeting, various issues, demands and problems being faced by the residents of Jammu were discussed in detail, highlighting the ongoing development work, cleaning of lanes and drains, proper functioning of street lights and other related work of Jammu.

He demanded immediate action to redress these griev-

ances so as to ensure effective delivery of basic amenities to the people. Billawaria said that the EESL company has failed to provide smooth functioning of street lights to the people of Jammu city. Billawaria, further said that several delegations of market associations have lodged complaints with him regarding the non-functioning of street lights and the ongoing project of beautification of Jammu Bazar under Smart City. He urged the Corporation Commissioner to repair

the street lights installed in all the markets and mohallas on priority on Holi festival. He said that the work being done by the sanitation corporation commissioner Devansh Yadav and his team for cleanliness in Jammu city is commendable and praiseworthy.

He stressed that cleanliness is the responsibility of every citizen and urged the people to use dustbins for disposal of their garbage and keep their surroundings clean. He appealed to the cit-

izens to bring Jammu city ranking up from the bottom in Swachh Survekshan" and said that they should not throw garbage in the deep drains of their area and cooperate with the municipal corporation. He further said that if the citizens of Jammu cooperate with the Jammu Municipal Corporation, then the ranking of Jammu city will increase compared to last time. He said that though the term of the corporators who represent Jammu Municipal Corporation has ended, but the corporators are still solving the problems of the people by coordinating with the officers of the Municipal corporation. Jammu Municipal Corporation Commissioner Devansh Yadav listened the various demands raised by former Deputy Mayor Jammu Baldev Singh Billawaria and assured that the Municipal Corporation will give priority to these issues and work towards finding solutions.

MLA Akhnoor inspects Flood Control, Irrigation Projects, Emphasizes Quality Assurance

Akhnoor MLA Mohan Lal Bhagat inspected various flood control and irrigation projects in the region to assess their quality. During his visit, he examined the ongoing modernization work on the Main New Pratap Canal between RD 4200 - 10000 meters, being carried out by the Irrigation Department at a cost of ₹70.24 lakh. Local residents praised the quality of this work.

The MLA also toured flood-affected areas along the Chenab River, including Chak Kirpalpur, Muthi, Maira, Chak Sikander, and Sittar Dyala, where rising water levels have impacted the region. He directed the Flood Control Department to prepare a Detailed Project Report (DPR) on a priority basis. He acknowledged that despite ongoing embankment and protection works, some areas were left out, leading to submerged farmland due to recent water level rise. He revealed that the department has prepared a ₹5.04 crore DPR,

which he will present to the concerned minister. Additionally, the Deputy Commissioner of Jammu has assured ₹40 lakh under SSSY for emergency relief work.

To address delays in Maira's ongoing flood control work, MLA Mohan Lal facilitated coordination between department officials, contractors, and local residents, ensuring the resumption of work. He urged the public to monitor construc-

tion quality and shared his personal mobile number, encouraging people to report any irregularities. He made it clear that negligence and corruption will not be tolerated, and strict action will be taken against those responsible.

The MLA assured that all flood control and irrigation-related issues in Akhnoor will be addressed on priority. During the inspection, key officials and dignitaries

LOP leader meets with families of Billawar deceased, assures strict action

BJP General Secretary and Leader of Opposition (LoP) in Jammu & Kashmir, Sunil Sharma, met the families of Darshan Singh, Yogesh Singh and Varun Singh, of the Malhar area of Billawar tehsil, Kathua district, who were found dead on Saturday. The three individuals had gone missing on Thursday evening while traveling to a wedding in Lohai Malhar. He also spoke to a large number of people at Billawar.

During his meeting, Sharma expressed deep condolences to the bereaved families and assured them that the BJP, both at the national and local levels,

stands firmly with them in this moment of sorrow and grief. He vowed to take up the matter at the highest levels to ensure justice for the victims and their families.

Sunil Sharma raised serious concerns about the circumstances surrounding the deaths, doubting the possibility of a deeper conspiracy aimed at destabilizing the region, by making attempts to revive militancy in Billawar, Bani, Basohli, Doda, and Kishtwar areas. He stressed the need for a comprehensive and transparent investigation into the incident, he assured that the culprits will not be spared.

"This is not an isolated incident; there is a pattern emerging that cannot be ignored. There have been con-

tinuous efforts by anti-national elements to revive terrorism in these areas. He urged the administration and security agencies to conduct a thorough investigation and expose the real culprits behind these mysterious deaths.

He further emphasized that no stone be left unturned in bringing the perpetrators to justice. "The government and the security forces are capable of defeating the designs of anti India dispensations sitting across the borders. The BJP will not tolerate any attempt to disrupt peace and stability in the Jammu region," he added.

Sharma also urged the Lieutenant Governor and security agencies to enhance

surveillance and security measures in these sensitive areas. The people of Billawar, Basohli, and adjoining regions have bravely stood against terrorism in the past. The administration must be more vigilant to ensure their safety and prevent any resurgence of militancy, he stated.

Sunil Sharma reaffirmed that the party remains committed to upholding peace, security, and the rights of the people of Jammu & Kashmir. He called upon security agencies to intensify efforts to curb any nefarious designs aimed at reviving terrorism in the region.
