Officers from various departments participated, including the Sub-Divisional Magistrate DH Pora, Bashir-ul-Hassan, Assistant Commissioner Revenue Reyaz Ahmad Shah, DYSP Ayoub Rather, Civil Defence and SDRF in-charge, Engineers from all concerned de-



partments, CRPF Officers, Tehsildars of all Tehsils, along with teams from SDRF, Fire & Emergency Services, Aapda Mitra Volunteers, and other disaster response units.

During the session, Dr Aamir emphasized the importance of preparedness and proposed the execution of mock drills near Kousarnag Lake, a potential GLOF

risk site. He stressed the need for the deployment of medical teams during drills, the formation of additional volunteer groups, and the active involvement of all stakeholders in strengthening community-level disas-

In a proactive move to assess monsoon-related damages and expedite development works, MLA Mohan Lal conducted a comprehensive tour of Akhnoor town on Wednesday. Accompanied by officials from various key departments, the MLA visited multiple affected areas and chaired a review meeting to issue necessary directives for time-bound execution of critical projects.

Prominent among those present were Municipal Committee Executive Officer Tahir Hafeez, Executive Engineer Jal Shakti Department Rocky Mahajan, Executive Engineer PWD Sunil Dogra, Assistant Engineer Electric Department Farooq, Assistant Executive Engineer Flood Control Department Sanjeev Choudhary, AEE Irrigation Anil, and other concerned engi-

During the visit, the MLA inspected areas including Jia Pota, Geeta Colony near Kameshwar Temple, Bus Stand, and surrounding regions impacted by recent rains. He instructed that the town be initiated within a week and emphasized immediate cleaning of all major drains to prevent water-

He further directed the preparation of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) for upcoming municipal works and outlined several key projects to be prioritized. These include the construction of a Jhula bridge, an Asthi Visarjan Ghat, beautification of the town's historic ponds, and a new concrete bridge from Gurha He also instructed PWD to clear accumulated soil over storm drains near Pulli Temple and ensure complete restoration of roads and lanes affected by pipeline laying under the AMRUT Scheme.

Advocate Rattan Lal Gupta, Provincial President of Jammu & Kashmir National Conference, has strongly dismissed speculative media narratives suggesting that fresh Assembly elections would be mandatory following the restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

In a statement issued here today, the senior NC leader termed these assumptions as "constitutionally unfounded and democratically misleading.

He was responding to recent remarks by the Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, who stated he has no objection to dissolving the current Assembly if statehood is restored. While welcoming Omar Abdullah's statement, he clarified that "dissolution of the Assembly is not a constitutional com-

Citing the constitutional framework, Rattan Lal Gupta emphasized that the reorganisation of states and Union Territories is governed by Article 3 of the Constitution of India, which empowers Parliament to create new states, alter boundaries, or change the status of existing territories. It was under this provision that the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 was passed—leading to the bifurcation of the erstwhile state into two UTs: Jammu and Kashmir (with a legislature) and Ladakh (without a legislature). "The Constitution does not mandate the dissolution of a UT's Legislative Assembly while elevating it to statehood," he said, adding "Parliament can simply amend the existing Act to convert the UT back into a state, without disbanding the present Assem-

of India would introduce a reorganization bill in parliament changes the status from UT to State, defines thereby the structure of legislature, governance and transition provisions, then parliament can choose to continue the existing Assembly as the first legislative Assembly of the new State of J&K.

Drawing historical context, the senior NC leader pointed out the 1987 example of Goa, where the UT was granted statehood and its legislature continued briefly before being dissolved for fresh elections. "Even then, there was no constitutional obligationonly a political will to start afresh under new circumstances," he said.

On the larger question of statehood restoration, Rattan Lal Gupta expressed concern over the continued delay despite repeated assurances from the Centre.

"The Government at the Centre keeps saying statehood will be restored at an appropriate time, but now it $is the \, most \, appropriate \, time \,$ to restore statehood to J&K,

Highlighting the return of peace and normalcy in the region, he noted, "We've had record-breaking tourist footfall, successful conduct of the G20 summit, a smooth Amarnath Yatra underway, etc. What further evidence does the Centre require to acknowledge normalcy and restore the democratic dignity of J&K?"

The Provincial President asserted that the current J&K Assembly—elected under the UT structure—still represents the people's will and should not be undermined by speculative narratives. "This is the people's government. And the law allows for its continuation even as Jammu and Kashmir transitions back to fullfledged statehood.
