Great day, says Trump

NEW DELHI, OCT 13: As part of the new Gaza ceasefire agreement, Hamas today released all 20 Israeli live hostages to Red Cross in exchange for more than 1,900 Palestinian prisoners held in Israel, bringing an end to the war which started on October 7, 2023 after the Hamas attack.

The hostages were released in two phases. In the first phase, seven hostages were released in the morning, and in the second phase, 13 more were released. They will be returning homes after two years of deadly war. Meanwhile, US President Donald Trump - the mediator of the ceasefire - arrived in Israel ahead of his scheduled visit to Egypt for the Gaza peace summit.

"The war is over. This is a great day. This is a new beginning," Trump said welcoming the ceasefire. He Hamas would comply with the plan to disarm.

He declared that the war in Gaza was over - but the negotiations were not.

In a speech to the Israeli parliament, Trump employed his usual hyperbole to describe this moment, calling it a "historic dawn in a new Middle East".

But this is only the first phase of his 20-point plan, and major obstacles remain - including questions over the future of Hamas, the scale of the Israeli withdrawal and who will govern

Progress will only be made if Trump remains engaged with this process. He is known, however, for not having patience with long and difficult negotiations or being interested in discussing details that are inevitable in any decent deal.

Trump has expressed his desire to expand the Abraham Accords - a key achievement in his first further asserted that term that saw Israel normalise relations with four Arab states - with the major goal of reaching a deal between Israel and Saudi Arabia.

That, however, is unlikely to happen without a clear path for Palestinian statehood, something the Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has strongly rejected.

There is huge momentum and hope, but words alone will not solve the many conflicts in this region.

The others included Evyatar David, Alon Ohel, Avinatan Or, Ariel Cunio, David Cunio, Nimrod Cohen, Bar Kuperstein, Yosef Chaim Ohana, Segev Kalfon, Elkana Bohbot, Maxim Herkin, Eitan Horn, and Rom Braslavski.

Ahead of their release, some of the hostages spoke to their families through video calls. The calls were full of emotions as families saw their loved ones after two years.

The Israel Defence Forces posted an update on social media under the title Operation "Returning Home", confirming that the seven released hostages were being accompanied by IDF and ISA personnel on their return to Israel, where they would undergo an initial medical assessment.

"The commanders and soldiers of the IDF salute and embrace the returning hostages as they make their way home to the State of Israel," the statement read.

It also included a call to the public to act responsibly and with sensitivity, to respect the privacy of the hostages, and to rely only on official information. The IDF added that it was prepared to receive additional hostages expected to be



He directed the university to establish a specialised faculty for languages to offer integrated courses in Hindi, Dogri, French and German. He emphasised on encouraging students enrolled in foreign languages and technical courses to also pursue Hindi and Dogri languages.

He also instructed the SMVDU to implement the complete digitalisation of all uni-

The nomination process for Nagrota and Budgam assembly segments began today, with the Election Commission of India (ECI) issuing two separate notifications for them.

In the notifications, the ECI said that candidates could file their nomination papers until October 20 for 7-Nagrota and

The poll-body announced that scrutiny of nominations would take place on October 22, while the last date for withdrawal of candidature was October

The voting was scheduled for November 11, with counting set to take place on November 14.

The ECI had on October 6 announced the schedule for by-election to the two assembly constituencies along with Bihar Assembly election.

Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar had told a press conference in Delhi that the by-election to two seats in J&K would be held on November 11, while counting would take place on November 14.

The Nagrota seat fell vacant after the death of BJP leader Devender Singh Rana on October 31 last year, just a couple of weeks after the assembly election

results were declared in Jammu and Kashmir.

Before joining BJP, he represented National Conference from the constituency. He had later joined BJP and contested election from Nagrota constituency on BJP ticket. The Budgam seat fell va-

cant on October 21, 2024 after chief minister Omar Abdullah vacated it and retained Ganderbal seat after winning from both the seats in the assembly election last year. He had contested from two assembly constituencies.
