**NEW DELHI, NOV** o3: Gold prices fell by Rs 300 to Rs 1,25,300 per 10 grams in the national capital on Monday as a stronger dollar and easing global uncertainties weighed on investor appetite for the safe-haven asset.

The precious metal of 99.5 per cent purity declined by Rs 300 to Rs 1,24,700 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had closed at Rs 1,25,000 per 10 grams on Friday, according to the All India Sarafa Association. Gold of 99.9 per cent purity had settled at Rs 1,25,600 per 10 grams on Friday.

#### 20 killed as powerful quake iolts Af'stan

KABUL, NOV 03: A powerful 6.3 magnitude earthquake that struck Afghanistan northern overnight killed more than 20 people and injured around 320, the health ministry said Monday.

In the Balkh and Samangan provinces "around 320 countrymen have been injured and more than 20 have been killed," ministry spokesman Sharafat Zaman said in a video message shared with journalists, specifying that this was a preliminary toll.

## LG lays foundation of new houses for Chisoti flood victims

Stating that Atholi-Machail Mata road would be reconstructed, LG Manoj Sinha todav laid the foundation stone for the construction of new houses for the flood-affected families of Chisoti in Kishtwar district, where 64 people, mostly pilgrims, lost their lives in a massive cloudburst & the resulting flashfloods on August 14 this

Sinha, who visited Chisoti, laid the foundation stone of new houses for the flood-affected families and paid homage to citizens & security personnel who had lost their lives in the cloudburst.

19 houses, that were completely damaged, would be rebuilt free of cost with the support of High-Range Rural Development Society (HRDS India), a Civil Society Organisation.

"The catastrophic floods swept away precious lives, wiped out several homes

#### SC 'shocked' at scale of digital arrest scams, vows tough action "We have to strengthen

NEW DELHI, NOV o3: The Supreme Court on Monday said it needs to deal with digital arrest cases with an iron hand as it expressed shock over the scale of such cybercrime cases in the country, with over Rs 3000 crore allegedly extorted from victims, including senior citi-

Digital arrest is a growing form of cybercrime in which fraudsters pose as law enforcement or court officials or personnel from government agencies to intimidate victims through audio and video calls. They hold the victims hostage and put pressure on them to pay money. A bench of Justices Surya

Kant, Ujjal Bhuyan and Joymalya Bagchi, which appointed an amicus curiae to assist the court in the matter, perused two sealed cover reports submitted by the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Central Bureau of Investiga-

"It is shocking that over Rs 3000 crore have been collected from the victims, including senior citizens, across the country. If we don't pass stringent and harsh orders, this problem will magnify.

### **Pakistan secretly conducting** nuclear tests: Trump

NEW DELHI, NOV o3: US President Donald Trump, during a recent interview, made a huge revelation when he mentioned that Pakistan has been secretly testing nuclear weapons. He also reiterated that

the United States would resume its own nuclear testing to 'keep pace' with other powers, including Russia, China and North Korea. Trump said that while

the US had refrained from testing for over three decades, several countries,



tinue to carry out underground nuclear trials away from global scrutiny. "We're going to test be-

cause they test," Trump said.

"And, certainly North Korea's been testing. Pakistan's been testing. They

don't go and tell you about it. They test way underground, where people don't know what's happening. You just feel a little vibration."

Trump's comments mark the first time a sitting US president has directly accused Pakistan of continuing nuclear testing.

He said other nations such as Russia and China were also secretly conducting tests while avoiding public discussion. "We're an open society. We talk about it. They don't have



In their talks, the two ministers also agreed to develop a common understanding to commence negotiations for a double taxation avoidance agreement (DTAA). This would help eliminate double taxa-
