When the House business was about discussion on the LG's address, how they moved the resolution, Sharma asked.

Earlier, deputy chief minister Surinder Choudhary moved the resolution for restoring Article 370 which was revoked by the Centre on August 5, 2019. The motion was seconded by senior NC leader and health minister Sakina

"This Assembly reaffirms the importance of the special status and constitutional guarantees, which safeguarded the identity, culture and the rights of people of Jammu and Kashmir, and expresses concern over their unilateral removal," the resolution said.

It added that the assembly calls upon the Government of India to initiate a dialogue with the elected representatives of Jammu and Kashmir for the restoration of special status and constitutional guarantees, and to work out constitutional mechanisms to restore these provisions.

"This assembly emphasises that any process for restoration must safeguard both national unity and the legitimate aspirations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir," the resolution added.

After the resolution was passed by a voice vote, a ruckus broke out in the Assembly, following which Rather adjourned the proceedings for 15 minutes. However, after the Assembly met again, BJP members continued with their protest and raised slogans against the Speaker as a result of which he adjourned the proceedings till Thursday.

The NC resolution was also supported by non-coalition partners. All the three PDP MLAs, Awami Ittehad Party (AIP) MLA Sheikh Khursheed, Independent MLA Shabir Kullay and Peoples Conference chief Sajad Lone supported the resolution.

The NC has the support of 55 legislators in the 90-member House. The support of the non-coalition legislators on the resolution pushed the number of supporters to 60 leg-

Article 370 was abrogated by the Centre in 2019 when the erstwhile state was divided into the two Union Territories (UTs) of J&K and Ladakh.

Around 180 fields for jointness have been identified, with 30% of the goals achieved and work on the rest being accelerated, he said.

The theaterisation model being pursued involves raising the China-centric northern theatre command in Lucknow, the Pakistan-centric western theatre command in Jaipur, and the maritime theatre command in Thiru-

"Initially, some hiccups were there, and the pace was slow. But now the pace will be very fast," the army chief had said on October 1.

Jointness came into sharp focus at the Joint Commanders' Conference on September 5 in Lucknow where defence minister Rajnath Singh made a firm push for cultivating a joint vision, preparing for future wars, and delivering a synergised, swift and proportionate response to provocations.

In September, Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff (HQ IDS), a single-point organisation for jointness under the defence ministry, conducted a crash course for senior military officers with a focus on boosting jointness and integration among the armed forces, an essential prerequisite to the creation of theatre commands.

In his NDC address, Dwivedi also spoke of force restructuring to boost war fighting capabilities. "The army's restructuring includes Rebal 1.5 (rebalancing) to refine command, control, and training, with Rebal 2.0 focused on adapting structures for emerging DIME (diplomatic, information, military and economic) interdependencies," he

Key initiatives include, establishing integrated battle groups for the mountain strike corps, forming specialised units like the Signals Technology Experimentation and Adaptation Group (STEAG), which has developed secure mobile networks, and expanding cyber, electronic warfare, and intelligence units, he added.

The army raised STEAG earlier this year to tap futuristic technologies, including artificial intelligence, 5G, 6G, machine learning and quantum computing, for their mil-

The army is advancing its modernisation efforts to prepare for future conflicts through enhanced capabilities across weapons, systems, and logistics, adaptable to highaltitude and diverse terrain operations, he said

"Precision fire capabilities are being refined with a focus on accuracy, long-range munitions, and effective poststrike assessments... Logistics efficiency is being enhanced with the use of logistic drones and robotic mules, with a tri-service approach to inventory management".

Won't allow Assembly to function until resolution on Art 370 withdrawn: BJP

Opposition BJP today said it would not allow the proceedings of Jammu & Kashmir Assembly to go on until the resolution on restoration of Article 370 was withdrawn by the Omar Abdullahled J&K government.

'This is an illegal resolution and until they roll it back, we will continue our protest and not allow the proceedings of the House. They will have to roll it back and then we will debate it," Leader of Opposition in the Assembly Sunil

Sharma told reporters here. He said the resolution was not part of the Assembly's listed business and reflects the mindset of the newlyelected government in the Union Terri-

Sharma said the provisions of Article 370 of the Constitution, which had conferred special rights on the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir, was abrogated in Parliament, the highest temple of democracy.

"Then some people challenged the Parliament's decision in the Supreme Court. The court ruled that the Parliament's decision was right. So what constitutional right do they have to bring this resolution? We have opposed it strongly and the BJP will continue its protest and not accept it at any cost," he said.

Taking a dig at Speaker Abdul

Rahim Rather, Sharma said he behaved as an agent of the ruling National Conference (NC) and "ripped apart" the dignity of the chair.

He also asked the Congress, an alliance partner of the NC, to clear its stand on the resolution.

"Congress leaders should come out and clearly say whether they support it or not. If they support it, the people of the country will question them. If not, then without their six MLAs, the resolution as well as the government is in minority," Sharma said.

He said the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has promised that statehood will be restored to Jammu and Kashmir, but "we have to wait for the appropriate

Earlier, the external affairs minister met Peter Dutton, the leader of the Liberal Party of Australia. "Shared perspectives on global issues and appreciate his support for our bilateral ties," Mr. Jaishankar said after meeting Dut-

He also met New Zealand's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Winston Peters in Canberra.

"Discussed education, technology, agriculture, technology and people-topeople ties. Also exchanged views on Indo-Pacific and global issues," Jaishankar said on his meeting with Pe-

He also met UAE's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

"So nice to meet my friend DPM & FM @ABZayed of UAE in Canberra today," the EAM posted on X.

From Australia, Jaishankar will travel to Singapore, where he will address the 8th Roundtable of the ASEAN-India Network of Think Tanks. He will also meet the leadership of Singapore to review the close partnership between the two countries.

He said the vital observations of the surprise inspection committees regarding the irregularities observed during the inspections were communicated as a report to the respective schools.

"The replies submitted by the schools were examined in detail by the Board. Based on the inspection findings and supported by videographic evidence, affiliation of 21 schools was withdrawn and six schools were downgraded from senior secondary to secondary level," he added.

Of the 21 schools whose affiliation has been withdrawn, 16 are in Delhi while five of them are in Rajasthan's coaching hubs - Kota and Sikar.

Ajit Pawar's NCP releases manifesto; promises to raise Ladki Bahin scheme aid to Rs 2,100

MUMBAI, NOV 06: The NCP led by Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on Wednesday unveiled its manifesto for the state assembly polls, promising to raise the amount of Ladki Bahin scheme's monthly financial assistance to Rs 2,100 from the present Rs 1,500.

leaders also released the poll For farmers, the party promised to raise the Shetkari Sanman Nidhi scheme amount from Rs 12,000 to Rs 15,000 per year. The Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) is contesting the November 20 assembly elections as part of the ruling Mahayuti alliance, which also comprises the Shiv Sena and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The NCP, which is fight-

ing the elections from 52 constituencies, also unveiled constituency-specific manifestos for all the assembly seats it is contesting. The manifesto was unveiled separately by party president Ajit Pawar in Baramati, by its state unit president Sunil Tatkare in Mumbai, and working president Praful Patel in Gondia. NCP candidates and local

manifestos in their respective constituencies. Pawar unveiled both the party's state-level manifesto and constituency-specific manifesto for Baramati. Speaking on the occasion, he said. "We will present the New Maharashtra Vision within 100 days of government formation." In the manifesto, the party promises to increase the amount given to eligible women under the Mukhyamantri Majhi Ladki Bahin Yojana from the existing Rs 1,500 to Rs 2,100 per month. This initiative will be the

largest monthly DBT (direct benefit transfer) in Maharashtra's history providing benefits of Rs 25,000 each per year to over 2.3 crore women, it said. The manifesto, which gives 11 promises, talks about increasing the old age pension from Rs 1,500 to Rs 2,100 per month.

For farmers, the party has promised to raise the Shetkari Sanman Nidhi from Rs 12,000 to Rs 15,000 per year, combining support from both the central and state governments. It also talks about waiving the farm loan and giving 20 per cent additional subsidy for all crops sold under the Minimum Support Price (MSP). Besides this, the NCP also gave an assurance of Rs 25000 per hectare

bonus for paddy farmers. "We have resolved to build more than 45,000 'panand' roads in rural parts of Maharashtra.

This is the biggest plan to develop the rural agricultural infrastructure," the manifesto reads. The party's other promises include a commitment to create 2.5 million jobs and provide monthly stipends of Rs 10,000 to 1 million students through training.

It also promises Rs 15,000 monthly salary for Anganwadi and ASHA workers, to reduce electricity bills by 30 per cent while prioritising solar and renewable energy. "We vow to implement measures that will curb the prices of essential commodities, making them more affordable for everyone," the manifesto document said.
