Significant win for New Delhi WB's neutral expert backs India on 2 hydro projects in J&K

NEW DELHI, JAN 21: Over a rift between the two neighbouring countries on Indus Water Treaty, there has been a significant win for New Delhi in its dispute with Islamabad on the Kishenganga and Ratle hydropower projects in Jammu & Kashmir, with a neutral expert ruling in favour of the India's position.

While India has been pressing for resolution of the issues by the neutral expert as mandated under the Indus Water Treaty (IWT) between the two countries, Pakistan has been backing the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague to resolve them.

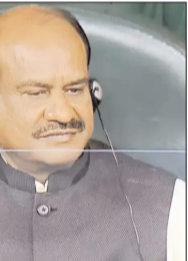
