A medical team comprising doctors and paramedical staff provided free healthcare services, including Gen-



sultations, along with free medicines and basic investigations such as blood sugar, anaemia and malaria testing. Screenings were also conducted for non-communicable diseases and tuberculosis under NTEP.

 $Awareness\,sessions\,covered\,the\,JK$ SEHAT App, PMJAY, PMJAY Vaya Vandana, E-Sanjeevani and Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission services, including ABHA ID generation. promoted.

The camp served 141 patients, including 76 in General OPD, 42 in Ophthalmic OPD and 23 in Dental OPD. Tests included 74 blood sugar, 38 anaemia and 27 malaria, while 16 ABHA IDs were generated on the spot. A schedule has been issued for conducting 'Hospital on Wheels' camps across all medical blocks of Ramban district.
