J&K UTLBC holds mega facilitation camps in Udhampur, Samba to help public reclaim unclaimed financial assets

Taking forward the nationwide initiative "Apki Poonji, Apka Adhikar – Your Money, Your Right", the Jammu & Kashmir Union Territory Level Bankers' Committee (J&K UTLBC) today successfully organised Mega Facilitation Camps in the districts of Udhampur and Samba to assist people in identifying, verifying and reclaiming their unclaimed financial assets.

The camps are part of a three-month campaign launched by the Department of Financial Services, Union Ministry of Finance, in coordination with the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), IRDAI, SEBI, and the Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (IEPFA). The initiative aims to help citizens recover unclaimed bank deposits, dormant insurance amounts, inactive mutual funds, unclaimed shares, dividends and other long-pending financial assets.

The outreach programmes witnessed encouraging public participation, including public representatives, brought together officials from the district administration, RBI and various banking institutions.

Udhampur Camp The Lead District Office,

Udhampur organised a district-level Mega Facilitation Camp, with Deputy Com-



loni Rai, as the Chief Guest. The camp was attended by LDO RBI Subin Kundal, DGM J&K Bank, Lead District Manager Udhampur, along with branch managers and officials from banks operating in the dis-

Addressing the gathering, the Deputy Commissioner lauded the efforts of financial institutions in driving the campaign and ensuring that unclaimed funds are returned to their rightful owners, describing the initiative as a significant step towards financial inclusion and customer empowerment.

Speakers highlighted the campaign's 3A Strategy -Awareness, Accessibility and Action, and encouraged banks to proactively identify and trace rightful claimants to ensure time-bound settlement of unclaimed accounts. Participants were also sensitised about the claim process, required documentation and the RBI's UDGAM (Unclaimed Deposits-Gateway to Access Information) portal.

As a major outcome, 57 unclaimed account claims Bank Cluster Head and rep-

amounting to Rs 61 lakh were settled on the spot. Of these, State Bank of India settled 16 accounts worth Rs 32.50 lakh, while J&K Bank settled 24 accounts involving Rs 24 lakh. Notably, Udhampur district has 54,675 unclaimed accounts amounting to Rs 16.93

Dedicated facilitation stalls were set up by banks to assist customers with re-KYC, account opening and enrolment under various social security schemes.

Samba Camp

The Lead Bank Office, Samba organised a districtlevel Mega Facilitation Camp at the Municipal Council Hall, Vijaypur, with Chairman, District Development Council Samba, Keshav Dutt Sharma, as the Chief Guest.

Dignitaries appreciated the efforts of the banking institutions and urged them to intensify outreach activities. The public was advised to keep bank records updated, complete KYC formalities in time and regularly operate their accounts to prevent deposits from turning unclaimed.

Participants were informed that Rs 13.16 crore is currently lying unclaimed in 54,666 accounts in Samba district. Awareness was also created about social security schemes such as PMSBY, PMJJBY and Atal Pension Yojana.

A key highlight of the camp was the distribution of cheques amounting to Rs 43.15 lakh among 32 beneficiaries by DGM RBI Vibha Gupta and Regional Manager Ankur Sharma, who had successfully reclaimed their unclaimed deposits.

Participants were also sensitised about the RBI's UDGAM portal, which provides a single-window platform for searching unclaimed deposits across
