drive was conducted on Friday in Doda town by the Food Safety Officer Doda, Legal Metrology Department, Consumer Affairs & Public Distribution (CA&PD) Department, under the supervision of the Executive Magistrate, Doda.

During the inspection, various Food Business Establishments (FBEs) were checked for compliance with the provisions of the **Food Safety and Standards** Act, 2006, the Legal Metrology Act and other relevant rules. The joint team examined hygiene and sanitation conditions, food safety practices, proper labelling, validity of licences and registrations, display of price lists, use of standard



weights and measures, and adherence to consumer

safety norms. Several establishments were found violating the prescribed norms. Accord-



ingly, errant Food Business Operators were compounded on the spot as per rules and were strictly directed to rectify the deficiencies immediately. In-

structions were also issued to ensure proper hygiene, safe handling and storage of food items, use of standard weights and measures, and strict compliance with statutory requirements.

The officers sensitised traders and food handlers about their legal responsibilities and emphasised that public health and consumer rights would not be compromised. The general public was advised to remain vigilant and report any violations related to food safety or unfair trade practices to the concerned departments. The district administra-

tion reiterated that such joint market checking drives will continue in the future to ensure the availability of safe and wholesome food and to safeguard the interests of consumers in the district.
