

Executive Committee of Home for the Aged & Infirm Reviews Functioning

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Home for the Aged & Infirm was held today at the Home premises under the chairmanship of its President, Er. Pankaj Gupta, to review the overall functioning of the institution and deliberate on key administrative, financial and welfare-related issues.

During the meeting, the minutes of the previous Executive Committee meeting held on December 26, 2026 were confirmed. The Income and Expenditure Accounts for the month of December 2025 were presented before the Committee and approved after detailed deliberations.

The Committee took note of visits by eight institutions and individuals during December 2025, who expressed appreciation for the quality of care, facilities and overall management of the Home. The enrolment of new Life Members during



the month was also approved following scrutiny of the prescribed application forms and receipt of membership fees.

Other important issues discussed included recovery of rent from shopkeepers, renewal of pending lease deeds, pay revision of employees, addition and alteration to the existing struc-

ture, progress on the provision of lifts, issuance of surplus stock, and interaction with inmates and staff to assess their welfare.

DIRECTIVE

Construction and Maintenance of road from L055-T01 Km 64th to Dhar Mahanpur, Package No. JK07-161, Block Basohli, District Kathua (Length 21.850 Kms)

- Whereas, the above-mentioned work was allotted to you vide NTP No. SE/PMGSY/J/3300-08 Dated 21-10-2022 and was completed on 01-08-2023 and is under 3rd Year Defect Liability Period.
- Whereas, during the site visit of the undersigned on 04-02-2026, it has been observed that "from the 7th km onwards" the various stretches of road have been deteriorated due to choked side drains, blocked catch pits, damaged Hume Pipe Culverts (HPCs), eroded berms/shoulders, defective black-topped surface and poor condition of road furniture, thereby posing serious safety hazards to vehicles and pedestrians, including accidents or damage to vehicles.
- Whereas, the Executive Engineer, PMGSY Division Kathua has repeatedly reported that despite issuance of several notices, no effective maintenance has been carried out as per clause 32.4 of SBD and the condition of the road continues to remain unsatisfactory.
- Whereas, your continued failure to discharge contractual obligations despite repeated opportunities amounts to gross violation of contract conditions, SBD provisions and PMGSY guidelines governing maintenance during Defect Liability Period.

"Neglecting the Road Maintenance exacerbated the effects of rain leading to the deterioration of road conditions during rainy season. If the road would have maintained by you properly as per schedule and as per clause 32.4, especially "Cleaning of surface drains including reshaping to maintain free flow of water and the Cleaning of culverts and pits for free flow of water", the damage of the road was avoided. The poorly maintained drainage system saturated the road base and subgrade which compromised the structural integrity of the road".

"Neglecting timely maintenance of pavement also led to a range of consequences with various cost implications. Small issues like cracks or potholes can quickly become larger and more serious problems if not addressed promptly. The cost of repairs escalates significantly for more extensive damage, as more materials, labour, and time are required to fix them. Failure to carry out resurfacing maintenance at the appropriate time soon leads to the need to carry out strengthening overlay works, which is at least twice as expensive as resurfacing. Similarly, if the overlay is not carried out soon enough, major deterioration sets in and pavement reconstruction will be required, which is at least three times more costly than an overlay. If the required maintenance is not carried out, drainage will become ineffective and surface defects will worsen, both of which result in water penetrating the structure of the pavement and accelerate the pavement deterioration".

Keeping in view of the above, you are hereby finally directed to mobilize men and machinery immediately and maintain the road from the 7th km onwards without any further delay.

"Treat this as final notice, no further correspondence shall be done from this office, if the work shall not commence within next three days, by or before 12th of February 2026, the termination of the contract shall be initiated as per clause 33.1, 52.1 and 52.2(c) of the SBD".

Further, as per circular issued from the office of Chief Engineer PMGSY JKRRDA Jammu vide no. CEJ/PMGSY/25646-66 dated: 29/01/2026, you are instructed to submit the revaluated Bank Guarantees to this office within three days which expired on 19.10.2023. As per Clause 46.2 of SBD, the Performance Security shall be valid until a date 45 days from the date of issue of certificate of completion of construction work and maintenance work subject to the condition that if the Performance Security is in the form of a Bank Guarantee, the period of validity of Bank Guarantee could be one year initially; however, the Contractor would get this Bank Guarantee extended in such a way that an amount equal to five percent of the Contract Price is always available with Employer until 45 days after the lapse of the Defects Liability Period. If the Contractor fails to maintain the above Performance Security, the Employer would recover the same from any dues payable to the Contractor.

The matter should be treated as MOST URGENT.

Mega Health Screening Camp for HIV & Hepatitis Held at District Jail Bhaderwah

On the directions of the Director General of Police, Prisons J&K Sh Deepak Kumar (IPS) and Deputy Commissioner Doda Sh Harvinder Singh (IAS), and under the able guidance of the Chief Medical Officer Doda Dr Tanveer A Rather, a mega health screening camp for HIV and Hepatitis B & C was organised for jail inmates at District Jail Bhaderwah, on 09-02-2026.

The camp was organised by the District Surveillance Unit (DSU), Doda, in collaboration with District Jail Bhaderwah, with active support from Government Medical College Doda and Sub-District Hospital Bhaderwah.

The programme was graced by the presence of Superintendent District Jail Bhaderwah, Shri Hamid Ullah Naik, Block Medical Officer Bhaderwah, Dr. Versha Sharma; along with officials from the CMO Office and BMO Office Bhaderwah.

A dedicated medical team from GMC Doda and SDH Bhaderwah conducted screening for Hepatitis B & C, along with general health check-ups. In addition, NCD screening, TB screening, and eye screening were carried out for more than 100 inmates lodged at District Jail Bhaderwah.

The primary objective of the camp was to ensure early detection of communicable and non-communicable diseases among inmates, facilitate timely referral and treatment, and promote preventive healthcare practices within the prison premises, thereby

strengthening inmate health and well-being.

Speaking on the occasion,

the Superintendent District

Jail Bhaderwah Sh Hamid Ullah Naik expressed his gratitude to the higher authorities including DG Prisons J&K, District Administration Doda, and the Health Department for organising such an important and much-needed health initiative.

He appreciated the coordinated efforts of all stakeholders and emphasized the significance of regular health screening camps in safeguarding the physical

and mental well-being of inmates.

Later, an awareness session was also conducted for the inmates, focusing on personal hygiene, mental health, disease prevention, overall well-being, and the importance of adopting a healthy lifestyle even within custodial settings.

Sat raises urban mobility and rural livelihood issues of Jammu & Kashmir in Rajya Sabha
