BJP ex-Dy Mayor visits Nai Basti, interact Market Association, shopkeepers, local residents

JAMMU, FEB 12: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Jammu & Kashmir General Secretary and former Deputy Mayor Jammu, Baldev Singh Billawaria, visited Nai Basti Market in Ward No. 23 and interacted with members of the Market Association, shopkeepers, and local residents. During the visit, he listened in detail to the concerns raised by the public regarding basic amenities, pending development works, and issues related to custodian land.

Representatives of the Nai Basti Market Association strongly demanded the construction of a community bathroom in the market area. They stated that Nai Basti Market is a busy commercial hub where a large number of people from distant areas come for shopping. In the absence of public toilet facilities, shopkeepers, women, elderly citizens, and visitors face significant inconvenience, which also affects the image and functioning of the market. Local residents also highlighted the issues concerning custodian land in the area. They pointed out that administrative hurdles related to land matters have delayed several development projects for a long time, thereby obstructing



the overall progress of the locality. The residents further demanded the early completion of works related to roads, drainage, sanitation, and other essential civic amenities.

Taking serious note of the grievances, Baldev Singh Billawaria assured the public that all genuine demands would be addressed on priority. He stated that the issues of Nai Basti Market are real and directly linked to public welfare, and therefore require urgent attention. Referring to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Swachh Bharat Mission, he said that the Prime Minister has clearly emphasized that

"cleanliness and basic amenities are the right of every citizen, and it is the responsibility of the government to ensure the strengthening of community toilets and sanitation infrastructure, especially in urban and densely populated areas."

He further assured that the matters concerning the construction of a community bathroom, issues related to custodian land, and pending development works would be effectively taken up with the local MLA and the concerned departments to ensure their early resolution.

Billawaria reiterated that the primary objective of the

Bharatiya Janata Party is to resolve the problems of the common people and ensure that development reaches the grassroots level. He emphasized that the BJP believes not merely in making promises but in delivering concrete results on the ground. SMVDSB holds consultations for structured rehabilitation of pony operators, other services

In pursuance of the decisions taken during the 76th Meeting of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) under the Chairmanship of Shri Manoj Sinha, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, JK-UT and in compliance with the directives of the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal (NGT), the Shrine Board convened a detailed consultative meeting with representatives of service providers including pony-wallas, pithus and palki-wallas associated with the Yatra along the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi track.

The meeting was chaired by Shri Sachin Kumar Vaishya, Chief Executive Officer, SMVDSB and was attended by senior officers of the Board along with a delegation led by Shri Bhupinder Singh and representatives of various stakeholder groups. The deliberations centered on developing a structured and sustainable rehabilitation framework designed to safeguard the livelihoods of traditional service providers, while simultane-



ously ensuring environmentally responsible and pilgrim-friendly management of the Yatra.

During the discussions, it was emphasized that the Shrine Board is committed to balance environmental sustainability with the socio-economic security of families dependent on Yatra-related services. It was also reiterated that the proposed rehabilitation plan is intended to create alternative and sustainable livelihood opportunities in line with the directions of the Hon'ble NGT.

Representatives of the service providers expressed concerns regarding the existing registration mechanism and the associated fee structure. They requested that the matter be taken up with the concerned administration for appropriate re-

view and resolution of issues related to the registration process.

The stakeholders further proposed the development of an alternate parking facility to ease congestion at the Banganga area, which witnesses heavy traffic during peak Yatra periods. The delegation also sought appropriate compensation as part of the rehabilitation package, emphasizing that the transition should be implemented in a phased manner to minimize disruptions and allow sufficient time for affected families to adapt to alternative income opportunities.

The Shrine Board assured the participants that all concerns and suggestions would be duly examined in consultation with the concerned quarters while finalizing the com-

prehensive rehabilitation framework.

Subsequently, in continuation of the consultative meeting held yesterday with stakeholders from the sports fraternity, the Shrine Board conducted an interaction session with young sportspersons to obtain valuable grassroots-level insights.

Athletes from various disciplines, including cricket, football, shooting, badminton, basketball, archery, judo and tennis, highlighted key challenges related to training, coaching, infrastructure and exposure which will help in formulating a comprehensive strategy for identifying talented person for strengthening sports development and creating a sustainable sporting ecosystem in the region.

AHD starts special mobile veterinary outreach in Udhampur

UDHAMPUR, FEBRUARY 12: The Animal Husbandry Department Udhampur has launched a special outreach programme utilising Mobile Veterinary Units (MVUs) to bridge the gap in veterinary services within the region's most inaccessible areas. This initiative, spearheaded by Chief Animal Husbandry Officer (CAHO) Udhampur Dr Shevatamri Khajuria, aims to provide clinical interventions and scientific education to livestock rearers who lack proximity to permanent veterinary infrastructure.

The inaugural event of this series was conducted in Sundrani Pachayat of Block Jib. Under the super-

vision of the District Veterinary Hospital (DVH) Udhampur, the camp attracted 250 participants. The primary focus of these sessions includes prophylaxis and disease control for educating farmers on prevention of prevalent zoonotic and livestock-specific diseases, dairy husbandry that encompasses training on scientific management practices to improve milk yield besides animal health and clinical services providing on-spot treatment and distribution of free medicines.

Superintendent of the DVH Udhampur Dr Anwar Hussain Nagoo emphasised that these outreach ef-

forts are part of a broader strategy to upgrade services and ensure that veterinary care reaches the doorsteps of the farming community. Upgradation of Veterinary Hospital at Udhampur is underway and likely to commence from next financial year and will ease the concerns of locals about receiving up-to-date veterinary care, said Dr Nagoo. The farmers were also briefed about the livelihood schemes of Animal Husbandry Department like HADP, IDDS, KCC, NAIP and ABIP aimed at enhancing Livestock Productivity Welfare, Modern Strategies and Regional Interventions by Dr Karun Gupta and Ridham Shahid.

PDUNASS Conducts Workshop on Insolvency Resolution Process for EPFO Leadership

NEW DELHI, FEB 12: The Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Academy of Social Security (PDUNASS), New Delhi, on Wednesday organised a half-day workshop on the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), 2016 for Members of the Central Board of Trustees (CBT), Members of the Investment Committee of CBT, and senior officers of the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO).

The workshop aimed at enhancing institutional understanding of insolvency resolution mechanisms and related legal and administrative issues relevant to EPFO, particularly in the context of safeguarding subscribers' interests.

Shri Ramesh Krishnamurthi, Central Provident Fund Commissioner (CPFC), graced the session virtually. Ms. Roli Shukla Malge, Financial Adviser & Chief Accounts Officer (FA & CAO), EPFO, also attended the programme online.

Shri Kumar Rohit, Director, PDUNASS, and Shri M.M. Ashraf, Additional Central Provident Fund Commissioner, were pre-



sent during the workshop. Members of the Central Board of Trustees, members of the Investment Committee, and officers from EPFO Head Office and PDUNASS participated in the deliberations.

In his address, Shri Ramesh Krishnamurthi underscored the importance of a clear and informed understanding of the insolvency resolution framework under the IBC for statutory bodies like EPFO. He emphasised that timely and well-considered decisions in insolvency-related matters are crucial to pro-

tecting the interests of EPFO subscribers while ensuring compliance with the evolving legal landscape.

Highlighting the relevance of such capacity-building initiatives, Shri Kumar Rohit noted that the workshop would equip EPFO's leadership and decision-makers with greater clarity, confidence and contextual understanding in handling complex legal and financial frameworks.

The workshop featured focused sessions on the insolvency resolution framework and legal finality under the IBC, along with

discussions on post-resolution recovery, exceptions and administrative closure. The interactive sessions enabled meaningful deliberations and knowledge exchange among trustees and senior officers on sensitive and intricate insolvency-related issues.

The initiative reflects PDUNASS's continued commitment to strengthening institutional preparedness and enhancing capacity within EPFO to effectively address legal and financial challenges arising under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.
