

SWD Srinagar conducts Training Programme on PC&PNDT Act

SRINAGAR, FEBRUARY 13: Social Welfare Department, Srinagar, through SANKALP–Hub for Empowerment of Women (Mission Shakti), successfully organized a Training-cum-Sensitization Programme on the PC&PNDT Act for owners of diagnostic centres in District Srinagar at the Conference Hall of Amar Singh College, Srinagar. The programme aimed

to strengthen compliance with the provisions of the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act and to sensitize representatives of diagnostic centres about their legal and ethical responsibilities. Representatives from ultrasound clinics, genetic counselling centres, genetic laboratories, and imaging centres across the district participated in the programme.

The initiative focused on reinforcing the objectives of the PC&PNDT Act, which was enacted to prevent sex selection and address the issue of declining child sex ratio.

Ruqaya Ashraf, District Mission Coordinator, Mission Shakti Srinagar, inaugurated the session with a detailed discussion on the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao initiative and the implementation of the PC&PNDT Act.

She emphasized the collective responsibility of stakeholders in ensuring strict adherence to the law.

Municipal Council Doda Launches Waste Segregation Awareness Drive

Acting on the directions of Executive Officer Sh. Yasir Hussain Wani, the Municipal Council Doda today deputed a special enforcement and awareness team to sensitize residents about proper waste segregation practices.

The team, headed by Shabir Ahmad, visited various localities across the town and interacted with residents at the household level, educating them on the importance of separating dry and wet waste.

The officials demonstrated simple methods of segregation and emphasized that proper waste management is essential for maintaining cleanliness and ensuring a healthy environment.



During the drive, citizens were clearly informed about adhering to municipal guidelines and were instructed to segregate dry and wet waste before handing it over to the door-to-

door collection vehicles for safe and systematic disposal.

The initiative forms part of the Council's ongoing efforts to promote sanitation awareness and strengthen

solid waste management practices in the town. Residents appreciated the outreach programme and assured their cooperation in maintaining cleanliness in their respective areas.

Sat flags Cold Storage shortage in Rajya Sabha

NEW DELHI, FEB 13: Jammu & Kashmir BJP President and Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha), Sat Paul Sharma, sought re-

ply on an important public-interest issue in the Rajya Sabha regarding the lack of cold storage and transport facilities in Jammu & Kash-

mir, particularly affecting perishable agricultural produce such as fruits, vegetables, dairy products, saffron, apples, and walnuts.

In response to the unstarred question, the Union Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Ramnath Thakur provided a detailed written reply outlining the measures being undertaken by the Government of India to strengthen post-harvest management and logistical infrastructure in the Union Territory.

The Minister informed that the Government is implementing various schemes aimed at creating and strengthening cold chain infrastructure and transportation facilities across the country, including in Jammu & Kashmir.

Under the Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), financial assistance is being provided for establishing cold storage units, controlled atmosphere (CA) storage, pack houses, refrigerated vans, and ripening chambers. Being a major horticulture-producing region, Jammu & Kashmir is receiving assistance under MIDH based on proposals submitted and approved by the State Level Executive Committee.

Additionally, under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan SAMPADAYojana (PMKSY) of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries, support is extended for the creation of integrated cold chains and value addition infrastructure, including reefer transport facilities.

The Minister further stated that the Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF) provides medium- to long-term debt financing for post-harvest management infrastructure, including cold storage and refrigerated transport systems. Support is also being extended under Operation Greens, which aims to stabilize supply and reduce post-harvest losses of perishable crops by promoting value chain development, storage, and transportation infrastructure.



Regarding timelines, the Minister clarified that the development of cold storage and transportation facilities is a continuous process and depends on viable project proposals, financial closure by proponents, and statutory clearances. Generally, projects sanctioned under these schemes are implemented within a period of 12 to 24 months.

On the question of inter-ministerial coordination, the Government stated that logistical infrastructure such as roads and railways falls under the mandate of the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways and the Ministry of Railways. A co-ordinated approach is being adopted to enhance multi-modal transportation networks and last-mile connectivity. Notably, action has already been initiated for setting up a Multi Modal Logistics Park at Jammu to facilitate timely transportation of agricultural produce, including apples, saffron, and walnuts.

To reduce and mitigate post-harvest losses, the Government is promoting scientific post-harvest management practices such as grading, sorting, and packaging; establishing cold chain infrastructure from farm gate to market; encouraging Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) for aggregation and better market linkage; implementing market reforms and digital platforms like e-NAM for improved price discovery; and providing capacity building and technical guidance to farmers and stakeholders.




Sat Sharma stated that strengthening cold storage and transportation infrastructure is crucial for safeguarding the interests of farmers and horticulturists of Jammu & Kashmir, reducing post-harvest losses, ensuring better price realization, and boosting the region's agricultural economy.

SHOBA YATRA ROUTE:-

"RANBIRESHWAR TEMPLE WILL PASS THROUGH INDIRA CHOWK- HARI MARKET- SHRI RAGHUNATH BAZAR – BHARAT MATA CHOWK - OLD HOSPITAL ROAD- PURANI MANDI - LINK ROAD - JAIN BAZAR- CHOWK CHABUTRA - PACCA DANGA- MOTI BAZAR- PARADE CHOWK AND THE YATRA WILL CULMINATE BACK AT SHRI RANBIRESHWER TEMPLE AT SHALAMAR ROAD."

DIVERSIONS:-


- **Library Chowk:** -The PSV's and four wheelers coming from various routes shall be diverted from Library Chowk towards Vigilance Rotary via Civil Secretariat
- **Govt. Degree College for Women Parade:** - The vehicles coming for Vigilance Rotary via fly over shall be diverted towards Library Chowk.
- **Directorate AYUSH:** - The movement of all the vehicles coming from Vigilance Rotary towards Indira Chowk shall be diverted from Directorate AYUSH towards flyover and shall remain restricted towards Indira Chowk as per ground requirement.
- **Ranbireswar Mandir Chowk** - All the Vehicles coming from Indira chowk towards Shalamar Chowk shall be diverted from Café Coffee Day near Ranbireswar Temple Rotary towards MLA Hostel.

Supporting Declarations:

In accordance with the ODF+ protocol, the following supporting declarations have been obtained and are maintained on record:

- Ward-Level Declarations:**
 - Each Ward Councillor/Ex-Councillor has submitted a declaration affirming that their respective ward meets all ODF+ criteria.
- Educational Institutions:**
 - All schools within the ULB jurisdiction have provided declarations stating that students and staff have access to functional and well-maintained toilets at school and home.
- Self-Help Groups (SHGs):**
 - Active SHGs have declared that all members and their families have access to and are using functional toilets.
- Public Feedback:**
 - A public announcement was made inviting feedback and objections regarding the ODF+ status. No substantial objections were received within the stipulated period.

After thorough verification and in the absence of substantial objections, the Municipal Council Reasi hereby adopts this final resolution declaring Municipal Council Reasi as Open Defecation Free Plus (ODF+).
