Terrorist hideout busted in Doda woods


Security forces today busted a terrorist hideout during a search operation in Chilli forests of Gandoth in Doda district.

Congress ignored Northeast, put country at risk: Modi

Accuses it of promoting insurgency



GUWAHATI, FEB 14: Launching an all-out attack on the Congress, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today accused the party of neglecting the strategically sensitive northeastern region and always endangering the country's security.

"Fear and insecurity marked the reigns of the

Congress in Assam. The party never prioritised the country's security and always put the nation at risk.

The purchase of weapons for the armed forces during the Congress rule was marked by corruption of thousands of crores," he said while addressing BJP workers at a rally here.

The prime minister accused Congress of neglecting the Northeast and pro-

moting insurgency in Assam during its rule.

"The Congress indulged in polarisation and vote-bank politics, and took decisions that promoted these," he said.

"The partition of the country took place due to the Muslim League, but now there is 'MMC' Maoist, Muslim, Congress and people should be aware," Modi added.

The prime minister accused Congress of neglecting the Northeast and pro-

meting insurgency in Assam during its rule.

He accused Congress of protecting infiltrators, but said BJP was "committed to end illegal immigration, and so the next five years are very important for the state".

He also claimed that the Congress, being out of power in Assam for 10 years, was "more dangerous than when it was in power, and this is evident from the venomous statements made by its leaders".

For seven decades, the Congress built only three bridges over the Brahmaputra, but the BJP government had constructed five bridges in 10 years, he asserted.

The PM said all-round development was taking place in Assam due to the efforts of the BJP government.

"BJP is committed to protecting Assam's identity and its traditions," he said.

"Assam is famed for tea, but now the state will be globally renowned for its semiconductor chips," Modi added.

Judicial leadership suffers when we pretend judges to be perfect: CJI



NEW DELHI, FEB 14: Chief Justice of India Surya Kant has said that judicial leadership does not suffer because judges are imperfect, but it is adversely impacted when judges pretend that they are not imperfect.

The CJI also called for a radical shift in how judicial leadership is perceived, advocating for the creation of a 'Commonwealth Apex Body' to integrate judicial education, the Bar, and the bench across the member nations.

Delivering the keynote address at the opening ceremony of the 11th biennial meeting of the Commonwealth Judicial Educators (CJEs) here, Justice Surya

Interest of Bangladesh comes first: Tarique on ties with India



DHAKA, FEB 14:

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) chairman and the country's prime minister-in-waiting Tarique Rahman on Saturday said he will prioritise the interests of the Bangladeshi people when asked about mending ties with India.

Addressing a press conference day after the BNP won a landslide victory in the general elections on Thursday, Rahman called for unity in the interest of Bangladesh and dedicated the victory to people who "sacrificed for democracy."

"This victory belongs to Bangladesh, belongs to democracy, this victory belongs to people who aspired to and have sacrificed



for democracy," he said.

He said the new government he will lead faces daunting challenges.

"We have paved the way for the establishment of democracy in the country," he added.

"We are about to begin our journey in a situation marked by a fragile economy left behind by an authoritarian regime, weakening constitutional and structural institutions and

destroying law and order," Rahman said.

Asked about ties with India, the BNP leader said, "We have cleared ourselves regarding the foreign policy, which is the interest of Bangladesh, and the interest of Bangladeshi people comes first. By protecting the interests of Bangladesh and the people of Bangladesh, we will decide our foreign policy," reported Indian Express.

The BNP alliance won 212 seats in the crucial elections on Thursday, the first since a student-led uprising ousted the iron-fisted rule of Sheikh Hasina in 2024. The alliance led by Jamaat-e-Islami and also
