"Humble tributes to the valiant martyrs who made the supreme sacrifice in the line of duty during the das-

tardly terrorist attack at Pulwama in 2019. Their unwavering commitment, unparalleled bravery and selfless service to the motherland will forever inspire every citizen," he said in a post on X.

A suicide bomber had crashed his explosive-laden vehicle into a bus ferrying CRPF personnel on February 14, 2019, resulting in the martyrdom of 40 cops and injuries to several others.

Days later, India had launched a retaliatory attack, which came to be known as the Balakot airstrike, destroying a JeM terror camp and killing several terrorists.

OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPAL COMMITTEE BARIBRAHMANA SOP FOR ZERO-WASTE EVENTS

Events (Official functions/Weddings/ Social or religious functions)

The vision of SBM-U 2.0 is to make all cities "Garbage Free". A key requirement for this would be to adopt 3R principles and principles of circular economy for reducing, reusing and recycling waste to ensure maximum resource recovery. Parallely, in alignment with Government of India's focus, SBM-U 2.0 also aims at phased elimination of single-use plastics.

Given that public events pose a challenge for cities in terms of generating substantial quantities of waste and their subsequent disposal, there is a need to ensure that going forward, all public events be conducted on "zero-waste" principles, to minimize the amount of waste generation and need for their safe disposal. This would be possible through use of environment friendly products/items, easy access to toilets and waste disposal facilities by all attendees at such events, with all COVID appropriate measures as mandated by Government of India in place.

To this end, an indicative SOP with suitable Do's/Don'ts is being proposed as per suggestive guidelines given below, for ULBs to ensure that any public event in their jurisdiction is a "zero-waste" or Swachh event.

- 1. Entrance**
 - * No plastic/ flex posters/ signages to be used. Use eco-friendly materials such as cloth, jute, paper etc.
 - * The welcome board at the gate should clearly mention that this is a Swachh or "zero-waste" event.
 - * No flowers/ decorations made of plastic to be used.
 - * Foot operated sanitizer machines to be placed at the entrance. Swachhata mascot cut-out may be placed next to the machine.

- * Clear signages directing participants to various areas of the event.
- * Access to the venue to be Divyang-friendly.
- 2. Registration Area (If applicable)**
 - * Appropriate physical distancing to be maintained.
 - * Registration using handheld tablets.
 - * Name tags printed on cardboard with jute/ cloth lanyards.
 - * Participant kit may include:
 - o Cloth/ jute bag made by SHGs from waste cloth
 - o Notepad made of recycled paper
 - o Eco-friendly plantable pens
 - o Mementos made from recycled materials (papier mache boxes, steel lapel pins, stainless steel bottles, etc.)
 - o QR code scanning for agenda/ papers instead of printed handouts.

- 3. Inside the Venue**
 - * No plastic water bottles, plastic cups or glasses. Only bio-degradable cups to be used.
 - * Drinking water dispensers with paper/ steel cups at accessible distances.
 - * Glass water bottles and glasses on dais for panelists (official events).
 - * Hand sanitizers at accessible distances.
 - * Minimal use of multi-layered wrapping paper, ribbons etc.
 - * Presentations to be shared digitally instead of printed handouts.
 - * No outside food/ beverages allowed inside the venue.
 - * Green & Blue bins with proper signages for bio-degradable and non-bio degradable waste.
 - * Bins to be emptied frequently and waste transported in segregated collection vans.

- 4. Dining Area**
 - * Only bio-degradable or reusable plates and cutlery (steel, bone-china etc.).
 - * Tie-up with NGOs for leftover distribution OR in-situ mobile composting.
 - * Bins to display key messages like "Humara Kachara Humari Zimadani", "Har Din Do Bin".
 - * Water-saving signage above wash basins.
- 5. Washrooms**
 - * Toilets for all gender groups available within premises.
 - * To this end, an indicative SOP with suitable Do's/Don'ts is being proposed as per suggestive guidelines given below, for ULBs to ensure that any public event in their jurisdiction is a "zero-waste" or Swachh event.
 - * Clean and usable toilet seats and urinals at all times.
 - * Clean wash basins with water availability at all times.
 - * Adequate ventilation and proper lighting.
 - * Functional door bolts on all toilet seats.
 - * Proper disposal facility for toilet effluents.
 - * Multiple cleaning cycles per day.
 - * Handwashing and water-saving signage.
 - * Ramps for Divyang attendees.
 - * Ladies' toilets to have sanitary pad vending machines.
 - * Wastepaper for wrapping sanitary pads.
 - * Separate bins for sanitary pad disposal.
 - * Soap dispenser machines in each toilet.
 - * Mobile SHE toilets and toilets for men and transgenders (if required).
