TRAFFIC POLICE ADVISORY FOR "NASHA MUKH J&K PADHYATRA-2026" ON 11.04.2026.

Through the medium of this Public Notice, the general public/ motorists are hereby informed that on 11.04.2026 (Saturday) "Nasha Mukh J&K Padyatra-2026" will be organized in City Jammu. In this connection the following diversions/ restrictions/Cut-off points will be made applicable on 11.04.2026 from 0900 Hours till conclusion of Rally (1400 hours expectedly).

ROUTE OF RALLY:-

• **ROUTE**

- M.A Stadium –Dogra Chowk – Bhagat Singh Chowk – J.P Chowk - Vivekananda Chowk – Raghunath Mandir – City Chowk – Shalamar – Ranbireswar Temple – Parade Ground.

DIVERSIONS/ CUT-OFF POINTS:-

1. All kind of traffic movement shall remain restricted on the Rally route during the movement of participants.
2. All Buses of Samba/ Kathua Axis shall operate from Ware House Bikram Chowk Jammu till conclusion of Rally and shall follow the route Kunjwani Chowk – Satwari Chowk – Military Hospital – Belicharana – 4th Tawi Bridge – Ware House and vice versa.
3. All Buses / HMVs of Rajouri/ Poonch/Akhnour Axis shall operate from JDA Ground near 4th Tawi Bridge till conclusion of Rally and shall follow the route Canal Head – 4th Tawi Bridge – JDA Parking and vice versa.
4. All Buses/ HMVs of Udhampur/ Reasi Axis shall operate from ISBT Narwal till conclusion of Rally and shall follow the route ISBT Narwal – Narwal – Qasim Nagar – Bajalta – Sidhra Bridge – TCP Nagrota onwards and vice versa.
5. PSVs from City North bound for Bagh-e-Bahu shall also adopt the route from Canal Head – 4th Tawi Bridge – Ware House – Asia Crossing – Bikram Chowk – DGP Residence – PHQ Rotary – P/S Bagh-e-Bahu Crossing – Bahu Fort.
6. Vehicles bound from City North towards Railway Station / Jammu Airport/ Satwari/ Kunjwani axis shall adopt the route from Canal Head – 4th Tawi Bridge – Beli Charana – Military Hospital – Satwari and Similarly the vehicles from City South towards City North shall adopt the same route.
7. LMV's coming from TCP Nagrota towards bound for City South Jammu shall follow the route from TCP Nagrota towards Sidhra via Sidhra Bridge or via Sidhra Cut – Atal Chowk – Circular Road – Gujjar Nagar Bridge – City South.
8. Tawi Bridge at Sidhra and 4th Tawi Bridge Bhagwati Nagar Jammu shall remain open for movement of General Public during the Rally. Further, the Tawi Bridge at Gujjar Nagar shall remain open in regulated manner subject to movement of rally.
9. Flyover from Bikram Chowk to Vigilance Rotary and vice versa shall remain open for routine movement of vehicles.

10. Cut off points for vehicles during Rally:-

- a. Bikram Chowk.
- b. K.C Crossing.
- c. Prem Nagar Cut.
- d. Fortune Rivera Cut.
- e. Indira Chowk.
- f. Vigilance Rotary (up tube towards Parade via flyover)
- g. Library Chowk.
- h. DC Office Crossing.
- i. Denis Gate.

No vehicle will be allowed to move ahead of these Cut off points during the passage of Rally participants. These cut off points will be applicable during the movement of rally only.

11. Available Parking Slots for parking of vehicles of participants:-

- a. Vehicles of participants coming from City South Jammu shall park their vehicles at Tawi River Front Parking (Mandir Masjid Point).
- b. Vehicles of participants coming from City North Jammu shall park their vehicles at Peer Baba Ground, Hockey Ground, Cricket Ground at GGM Science College and Abhinav Theatre Jammu.

General Public is requested to plan accordingly as per the above-mentioned diversions during Rally. In convenience to General Public is regretted.
