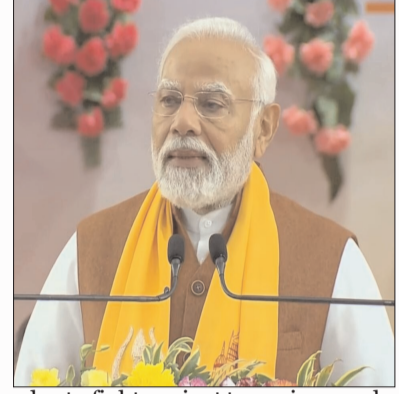

Pahalgam attack anniversary

India won't bow to any form of terror, says PM Modi

NEW DELHI, APR 22: On the anniversary of Pahalgam terror attack, in which 25 Hindu holidayers & a local were gunned down by terrorists, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today reaffirmed India's commitment to fight terrorism and said that India would never bow to any form of terror.



"As a nation, we stand united in grief and resolve. India will never bow to any form of terror. The heinous designs of terrorists will never succeed," he said.

"Remembering the innocent lives lost in the gruesome Pahalgam terror attack on this day last year. They will never be forgotten. My thoughts are also with the bereaved families as they cope with this loss," the PM said in a post on X.

The dastardly attack by Pakistan-based Laskar-e-Taiba terror outfit in Pahalgam's Baisaran meadow had left 26 people, 25 of them Hindu tourists, dead and triggered a four-day military conflict with Pakistan after Indian armed forces retaliated with Operation Sindoor targeting terror infrastructure inside Pakistan and PoJK.

Army had reaffirmed its steely re-

solve to fight against terrorism, making it clear that for acts against India, "the response is assured".

Paying tribute to the victims, President Droupadi Murmu said 'the country remains resolute in its determination to defeat terrorism everywhere in all its forms.'

"The tragic loss of innocent lives in that heinous act remains etched in our collective memory. I express my deepest condolences to the bereaved families. The entire nation stands with them. Such acts of terror cannot deter our unwavering commitment to peace & unity," she said.

Vice-President C P Radhakrishnan said such acts of brutality can never shake the country's resolve to uphold

peace, unity, and the enduring values of humanity.

"We remain firm in our determination to combat terrorism in all its forms and manifestations," he said.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah said India would continue its zero-tolerance policy against terrorism and those who harbour it.

"Terrorism is the greatest enemy of humanity, against which we must stand united to fight and defeat. India will continue its zero-tolerance policy against terrorism and those who harbour it," he said.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said the nation would not forget the victims and underscored the government's strong response to terrorism.

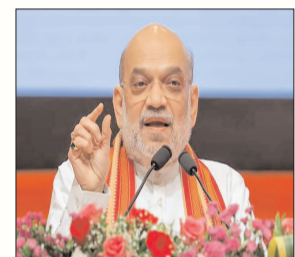

Taking names of politicians doesn't absolve Yasin Malik: NIA to HC

NEW DELHI, APR 22: NIA today told the Delhi High Court that taking names of senior politicians and bureaucrats does not absolve Yasin Malik or negate his links with terrorists like Hafiz Saeed.

The NIA filed a rejoinder to Malik's reply to its plea for enhancing his life sentence in a terror-funding case to death penalty and asserted that the Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) chief was "well connected with multiple terrorist organisations and with supporters of the terrorist outfit LeT" and that he dropped names of senior politicians, media personnel, foreign delegates and bureaucrats to gain popularity and draw public sympathy.

The NIA stated that Malik cannot be permitted to "revisit" the matter when the

charges against him have already culminated into his conviction and ample opportunity was given to him to raise objections.

A bench of justices Navin Chawla and Ravinder Dubeja took the NIA's rejoinder on record and listed the agency's appeal for hearing on July 21.

The bench also told Malik, who was virtually appearing from Tihar jail, that a copy of the rejoinder would be supplied to him through the jail authorities.

In his reply filed to the NIA's appeal, Malik had earlier said that he spent nearly three decades as a key figure in a state-sanctioned "backchannel" mechanism, working with a succession of prime ministers, intelligence chiefs, and even business tycoons to foster peace in Jammu and Kashmir.

'Can't put democracy in jeopardy' Apex Court raps Mamata Banerjee over I-PAC raid

NEW DELHI, APR 22: The Supreme Court of India on Wednesday slammed West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee for her interruption of an ED raid at I-PAC's co-founder Pratik Jain's home in January.

In a March hearing, the Supreme Court had stated that the TMC supremo's interference in the ED raid was "not a happy situation."

"This is, per se, an action by an individual who happens to be the CM who has used the entire system to put democracy in jeopardy," the top court told Banerjee after stating that a chief minister of any state cannot storm the premises

The ED raid, held in January over allegations of money laundering, became a political flashpoint after Banerjee stormed into Jain's residence during the raid. The central agency has alleged that the TMC leader removed key evidence from the site.

The Supreme Court's hearing also comes at a time when West Bengal prepares to go to the polls. The eastern state is set to vote in two phases on April 23 and April 29. The main contest for the state assembly is between the ruling Trinamool Congress and the opposition Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

The matter was heard by a bench of Justices PK Mishra and NV Anjaria. During the hearing, the bench stated that such ac

West Bengal all set to go for polls in first phase

NEW DELHI, APR 22: West Bengal, where campaigning ended for the first phase of elections yesterday, is all set to go for polls on 152 seats out of 294 on Thursday.

Elaborate security arrangements had been put in place to avoid any untoward incident on the occasion. More than 3.60 cr voters, including nearly 1.75 cr women, are eligible to cast their votes.

The contest will largely be about deciding the electoral fate of the ruling Trinamool Congress led by

Mamata Banerjee and its main challenger, BJP.

The second phase of elections for the remaining 142 seats would be held on April 29.

In the first phase, which covers 16 districts, elections would be held on 54 Assembly seats in north Bengal districts like Darjeeling, Kalimpong, Jalpaiguri, Alipurduar, Cooch Behar, North Dinajpur, South Dinajpur and Malda.

The remaining 98 Assembly seats falls in districts like Murshidabad, East Midnapore, West

India dominates world's hottest cities list

NEW DELHI, APR 22: India is currently at the epicentre of a global heat surge, with 19 of the world's 20 hottest locations recorded within the country.

Odisha, eight from West Bengal and two from Uttar Pradesh, according to data released by AQL.

The India Meteorological Department has warned that heatwave conditions are likely to persist from April 22 to April 24, with maximum temperatures expected to climb further touching up to 43°C in several regions.

Bhagalpur in Bihar, Talcher in Odisha and Asansol in West Bengal topped the list, with 44 degrees Celsius.

Cities at 43°C, included Begusarai, Motihari, Munger, Bhojpur, and Siwan, along with parts of eastern Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. Lumbini in Nepal was the only non-Indian location in the top 20, reports India Today.

Meanwhile, parts of southern and northeastern India are experiencing moisture and thunderstorms, highlighting a sharp contrast in weather patterns across the country.

Experts warn that this clustering of extreme temperatures signals rising climate variability. With a majority of the world's hottest cities now in India, the intensity and frequency of heatwaves appear to be increasing.

Iran seizes 3rd container ship in Hormuz after Trump extends ceasefire

TEHRAN/WASHINGTON, APR 22: Iran's Revolutionary Guards today seized three ships attempting to cross the Strait of Hormuz as US President Donald Trump extended a temporary ceasefire between both countries.

The IRGC in a statement earlier in the day confirmed the seizure of two ships.

"The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps naval force this morning identified and stopped in the Strait of Hormuz two violating ships," the Guards said in a statement.

ships... were seized by the IRGC's naval forces and directed to the Iranian coast."

They identified one ship as "MSC-FRANCESCA", which they said belonged "to the Zionist regime" in reference to Israel, and the other as "EPAMINONDAS", which they said was "tampering with navigation systems and jeopardising maritime security."

Iranian media later reported IRGC's naval forces have attacked a third vessel called the Euphoria. They said the vessel had become "stranded" on the Iranian coast, without elaborating.
