A drone was late last night found in Hatli area of Kathua district of Jammu, prompting security agencies to heighten surveillance and launch a probe.

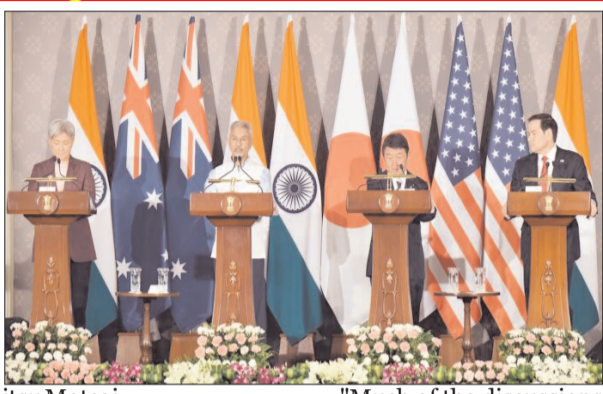

Quad ramps up Indo-Pacific surveillance, critical mineral cooperation

Flags China's maritime actions

NEW DELHI, MAY 26: The Quad grouping today expanded cooperation in critical minerals and energy while unveiling new measures to boost maritime surveillance and port infrastructure across the Indo-Pacific against the backdrop of China's growing military posturing in the region.



The new measures were announced following a meeting of the grouping's foreign ministers in New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and attended by US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Australian Foreign Minister Penny Wong and Japanese Foreign Minister Toshimitsu Motegi.

In his media statement, Jaishankar announced a critical minerals framework and an Indo-Pacific energy security initiative under the broader Quad agenda to confront major challenges facing the region.

"Because we are four maritime democracies located at different ends of the Indo-Pacific, the exchange of perspectives was an exercise of considerable value."

"We spent some time on the question of safe and unimpeded maritime commerce and reaffirmed the significance of scrupulously observing international law," the minister said.

Jaishankar said a free and open Indo-Pacific has many dimensions and facets and the Quad meeting took stock of the progress in many of them.

Shah announces high-level panel to study demographic changes

Cites national security concerns

NEW DELHI, MAY 26: Union Home Minister Amit Shah today announced that the Centre had constituted a high-level committee to assess demographic changes across India due to "illegal immigration and other unnatural causes".

"Infiltration and other reasons are causing unnatural demographic changes, which pose a significant challenge to the present and future of any nation," he said in a message on X.

"To address this very challenge, on August 15, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced a high-level committee on demographic change. I am delighted to inform you that the government has now constituted this committee," Shah said.

The home minister said the committee would be chaired by Justice Naolekar (retd) and will also include the census commissioner, along with retired IAS officer Durga Shankar Mishra, ex-IPS officer Balaji Srivastava and Dr Shamika Ravi as



members. "The joint secretary (foreigners-I), Ministry of Home Affairs, will serve as member secretary of this committee," he said. "Demographic change is a serious issue linked not only to the country's sovereignty but also to national security, law and order, profound changes in social structure and the preservation of tribal society," he added.

"This committee will conduct a comprehensive study on demographic changes and their impact on national security, law and order, and social structure. The committee will also recommend measures to address these challenges."

Red Fort car blast

Umer Nabi used fake identity to procure chemicals

NEW DELHI, MAY 26: NIA probe has found that Dr Umer Un Nabi, the key accused in the Delhi Red Fort car blast case, had used a fake identity to procure off-the-shelf chemicals for manufacturing explosives.

Nabi, who was driving the explosives-laden car and died in the blast, had researched offline and online resources related to various chemicals and set up a makeshift lab in his flat at Al Falah University in Faridabad for carrying out experiments with the objective of manufacturing a prototype explosive material, sources said.
