

# Door-to-Door Enumeration takes off in Kathua under Census 2027

The House Listing and Housing Census, the first phase of Census 2027, commenced across Kathua district today with field functionaries fanning out across urban and rural areas to undertake the month-long enumeration exercise.

Under this phase, enumerators have started visiting households to collect information relating to housing conditions, household amenities and other prescribed particulars as per the Census framework.

Deputy Commissioner Kathua and Principal Census Officer, Rajesh Sharma,

formation. He urged the residents to participate actively in the Census exercise, emphasizing that Census data serves as a critical foundation for planning and implementation of various welfare and development programmes.

To oversee the smooth conduct of the exercise, Additional Deputy Commissioner Mahima Madan conducted field visits in various areas of the district and reviewed the progress of enumeration activities on the ground. She interacted with enumerators and supervisors, inspected the enumeration process and assessed the preparedness of the field staff engaged in census operations.

The ADC underscored the importance of accuracy, completeness and timely collection of data, describing the Census as a vital exercise for evidence-based planning and formulation of developmental policies. She directed the field functionaries to adhere strictly to the prescribed guidelines and ensure effective coordination for the successful conduct of the exercise.

The House Listing and Housing Census shall continue till June 30, 2026, during which enumerators will undertake door-to-door visits to ensure coverage of every household in the district.

Pertinently, the Self-Enumeration facility under Census 2027 concluded on May 31, 2026. With the commencement of the House Listing and Housing Census phase, enumerators will authenticate and validate the information submitted online by households through the Self-Enumeration portal. Simultaneously, first-hand data will be collected from households that did not

Deputy Commissioner Doda Krishan Lal today chaired a comprehensive review meeting to assess the progress of credit-linked schemes under Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP), approval and rejection rates of beneficiary cases and issues affecting its implementation in the district.

The meeting was attended by functionaries from Agriculture, Horticulture, Floriculture, Fisheries, Sheep Husbandry, Animal Husbandry and the Employment and Counselling Centre, besides Chief Planning Officer (CPO), Nodal Officer HADP, Lead District Manager (LDM), representatives from banks and other stakeholders associated with the implementation of HADP.

The meeting deliberated upon challenges being faced in the registration process under HADP and explored measures to streamline beneficiary on-boarding.

The concerned departments and banking institutions were asked to strengthen coordination for effective implementation of HADP schemes and timely resolution of bottlenecks.

Special focus was laid on the promotion of innovative and high-value agricultural activities, including protected cultivation through greenhouses, cultivation of niche crops, honey production, mushroom cultivation and introduction of yellow and pink cauliflower varieties. The Deputy Commissioner encouraged departments to promote diversification and adoption of modern agricultural

practices to enhance farmers' income and productivity.

The meeting further reviewed credit-linked applications under HADP and the Jammu & Kashmir Competitiveness Improvement in Agriculture and Allied Sectors Project (JKCIP) in the horticulture sector. Discussions were held regarding apple plantation initiatives in the District. The Horticulture Department was asked to encourage farmers to adopt advanced and high-yielding apple varieties for enhancing production and improving orchard productivity.

The Deputy Commissioner directed stakeholders to ensure the accuracy of beneficiary data, particularly in cases involving farmers above 65 years of age. He stressed the importance of maintaining updated records to facilitate smooth processing of applications and effective delivery of benefits.

Additionally, the meeting reviewed Kisan Credit Card (KCC) registrations and

credit linkage of farmers. It was informed that there are approximately 35,000 active KCC accounts in the district.

The Deputy Commissioner emphasized the need to expand KCC coverage and urged departments and banking institutions to ensure that more eligible farmers are brought under the ambit of the scheme to strengthen agricultural and allied sector activities in the district. The status of KCC applications under the Animal Husbandry and Sheep Husbandry sectors was reviewed extensively. Detailed discussions were held on approval and rejection rates of cases. The Deputy Commissioner directed banks to carry out proper scrutiny and counselling of applicants to minimize avoidable rejections and ensure deserving beneficiaries receive timely financial assistance.

Reviewing the coverage under PM-KISAN, the meeting was informed that presently the district has around 42,392 beneficiaries

registered under the PM-scheme. Discussions were held regarding active and inactive; Aadhaar-linked and non-Aadhaar-linked PM-KISAN accounts, land-seeding status of active beneficiaries and issues affecting beneficiary authentication.

The Deputy Commissioner directed banks to expedite the KYC verification process of farmers whose registrations remain incomplete due to incorrect or insufficient information. "Eligible beneficiaries shall not be deprived of benefits due to procedural delays," he emphasized.

Reiterating the importance of convergence and coordination, the Deputy Commissioner directed the Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry and Sheep Husbandry departments to maintain close liaison with banking institutions to achieve the objectives of HADP and ensure maximum outreach of government schemes among farmers and rural entrepreneurs.

# DC Anantnag chairs NCORD meeting, reviews measures against drug abuse

**ANANTNAG, JUNE 01:** Deputy Commissioner (DC) Anantnag, Dr. Bilal Mohiuddin Bhat today chaired a meeting of the District Level Committee under the Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) to review the measures and overall response undertaken by various departments against drug abuse and trafficking in the district.

The meeting was attended by SP Sunny Gupta, ADC, Vikas Ahlawat, SDMs, SE Hydraulics and PWD, ACD, CEO, CMO, DSWO, ARTO, Tehsildars, Assistant Drug Controller, EOs of MCs, representatives of GMC Anantnag and GDCs besides other committee members and concerned officers.

During the meeting, the DC sought detailed Action Taken Report from all departments on important agenda points and directions issued during previous meetings. Enforcement, seizure and legal actions targeting drug supply, CCTV surveillance in

hotspots, IEC and Nasha Mukta Bharat/JK Abhiyan activities in educational institutions, Panchayats and urban areas, rehabilitation of victims, suspension/cancellation of licences of medical establishments and vehicles found violating rules and functioning of DDAC and ATF, status on proposal of DDAC by Social Welfare Department, among others, were reviewed threadbare.

Addressing the meeting, the DC said it is encouraging that awareness and enforcement activities are being carried out during the ongoing 100 day intensive campaign across the district. He called for adopting proper SOPs while taking the legal action and enforcement drives against drug peddlers adding the field level measures like destruction of poppy and cannabis plants are vital to reduce supply of the contraband substances. He issued directions to I&FC, E&T and other departments to conduct Bhang destruction drives along rivers, Nallahs and



other areas.

The DC said the inter-departmental coordination and sustained efforts are necessary to eradicate drug abuse in the district. He stressed on maintaining strict vigil in educational institutions and medical establishments, proper functioning and analysis of CCTV surveillance in hotspots and conducting intensified awareness cam-

paigns especially among vulnerable sections.

Appreciable progress has been made during the first two months of the 100 day intensified campaign and concerned departments must work on the treatment and rehabilitation of the victims through various self-employment and holistic initiatives, he remarked.

Dr. Bilal directed the departments to conduct the theme based activities with full energy and dedication, emphasising sustained awareness activities in hotspots and other critical areas so the vulnerable individuals are identified and counselled thoroughly.

On the occasion, the SP briefed the chair about the enforcement initiatives like registration of cases, arrests, seizures, and attachment of properties made in the district under NDPS Act and other rules. He informed that 213 NDPS cases have been registered, out of which 41 have been challaned besides 10 houses, 12 vehicles, two shopping complexes and two land parcels have been attached and 27 vehicles found involved in drug traf-
