

# 50 farmers from Dansal flagged off for medicinal plants training tour to Palampur

In a move aimed at promoting crop diversification and enhancing farmers' income, the Department of Agriculture Production & Farmers Welfare, Jammu on Tuesday flagged off a capacity-building training tour on Medicinal and Aromatic Plants (MAP) for progressive farmers of Sub-Division Dansal under the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP) 2026-27.

The training programme was organised under the guidance of Director Agriculture Jammu Anil Gupta and Chief Agriculture Officer Jammu Manohar Lal Sharma.

As part of the initiative, 50 farmers from the agricultural zones of Sidhra, Nagrota and KP Manwal were sent on an educational exposure visit to CSK Himachal Pradesh Krishi Vishwavidyalaya, Palampur, from July 1 to July 3.

The tour was flagged off by Sub-Divisional Agriculture Officer (SDAO) Dansal Ashwani Gupta in the presence of officials including Pankaj Bhawani, Parveen



Singh, Riffat Firdous and Vikram Singh.

Addressing the farmers, Ashwani Gupta highlighted the growing potential of medicinal and aromatic crops in boosting farm income through crop diversification and scientific cultivation. He urged participants to make the best use of the exposure visit by interacting with experts and gaining

practical knowledge on advanced farming technologies.

The training programme is aimed at providing farmers with practical knowledge on cultivation practices, processing methods, value addition and market opportunities in the medicinal and aromatic plants sector. Officials said the initiative

is expected to create new livelihood opportunities for farmers while contributing to sustainable agricultural growth in the region. The department reiterated its commitment to strengthening farmers' capacities through regular training, exposure visits and dissemination of modern agricultural technologies under HADP.

# Census 2027 Phase-I completed successfully across J&K, Ladakh

The first phase of Census 2027, comprising House Listing Operations (HLO), has been successfully completed across the Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh after a month-long field exercise conducted from June 1 to June 30.

Chief Principal Census Officer (CPCO) and Director Census Operations (DCO), J&K and Ladakh, Amit Sharma said the entire exercise was conducted fully through digital means, marking a major milestone in India's first end-to-end digital Census. He said the operation concluded smoothly without any major technical disruptions.

Congratulating all officers and officials associated with the exercise, Amit Sharma praised the efforts of Deputy Commissioners, Municipal Commissioners, Charge Officers, Nodal Officers, trainers, enumerators, supervisors and field staff for ensuring successful implementation of HLO within the stipulated timeline.

He said 24,071 digitally mapped and geo-referenced House Listing Blocks across 295 Census Charges



were covered in J&K, while 567 House Listing Blocks across 17 Charges were covered in Ladakh. The exercise ensured extensive coverage of urban, rural, border, tribal and remote areas.

The CPCO informed that the successful completion of HLO was supported by a large-scale capacity-building exercise. In J&K, 30 Master Trainers, 614 Field Trainers and 29,269 enumerators and supervisors were trained, while in Ladakh, 2 Master Trainers, 20 Field Trainers and 722 enumerators and supervisors underwent training. Over 27,000 Census kits were distributed in J&K and

around 800 in Ladakh. Amit Sharma said continuous monitoring, regular review meetings, district inspections and digital dashboard-based supervision played a key role in ensuring smooth execution of the exercise.

He also highlighted the role of extensive awareness campaigns through print, electronic and social media in generating public confidence in the digital Census process.

He noted that over 6.67 lakh households in J&K and 7,009 households in Ladakh had voluntarily submitted details through the Self-Enumeration portal before field operations

were covered.

Looking ahead, he said preparations for the next phase of Census 2027 have already begun. Work on District Census Handbooks will commence from August 1, while Population Enumeration in snow-bound areas of J&K and across Ladakh will be undertaken later this year, followed by enumeration in the remaining areas in February 2027.

Describing the completion of Phase-I as a significant achievement, Amit Sharma expressed confidence that the same spirit of teamwork and public cooperation would continue in the upcoming phases of Census 2027.
