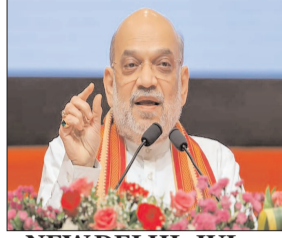

## Shri Amarnathji Yatra 2nd batch of 3,865 pilgrims leaves for valley base camps

Amid tight security, the second batch of 3,865 pilgrims today left the Jammu base camp for the holy Amarnath cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas.

According to officials, 3,865 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar base camp in a cavalcade of 201 vehicles escorted by security personnel and CAPFs.

Of the total pilgrims, 1,735 headed for the Baital base camp in 115 vehicles, while 2,130 pilgrims in 86 vehicles proceeded to the traditional Pahalgam base camp in the Anantnag district.
