Move forward shoulder to shoulder on issue of terrorism: Modi

Announces JWG with New Zealand

AUCKLAND, JUL 11: Announcing a major leap in security cooperation, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said that India and New Zealand had resolved to fight terrorism "shoulder to shoulder" by establishing a dedicated Joint Working Group, while simultaneously strengthening their commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific region in the United Nations.

"The two nations stand as reliable partners capable of navigating contemporary global challenges together," he said while addressing a gala lunch hosted in his honour by New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon in Auckland.

"Friends, on the global stage as well, India and New Zealand are reliable partners and close friends. We believe that to face the challenges of the current times, reform is necessary in global



institutions, including the UN. To move forward shoulder to shoulder on the issue of terrorism, we have formed a Joint Working Group today. Cooperation between India and New Zealand is extremely important for peace, stability, and security in the Indo-Pacific," PM Modi said.

Reflecting these priorities, the India-New Zealand Joint Statement reaffirmed both countries' commitment to "a free, open, peaceful, and prosperous Indo-

Pacific region, where sovereignty and territorial integrity are respected, and the rules-based international order is upheld."

The two leaders also reaffirmed "freedom of navigation and overflight" in accordance with international law, particularly the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), and stressed the importance of the peaceful resolution of disputes through dialogue and international law.

On multilateral cooperation, the Joint Statement emphasised the need for "bold and effective UN reform" and affirmed support for the expansion of the UN Security Council in both permanent and non-permanent categories. New Zealand also reaffirmed its support for India's permanent membership of a reformed and expanded UN Security Council.

The two Prime Ministers also reiterated their "absolute condemnation of terrorism in all its forms and manifestations, including cross-border terrorism," while strongly condemning the terrorist attack in Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir on April 22, 2025, and the terror incident near Red Fort in New Delhi on November 10, 2025.

Calling for a "zero-tolerance and consistent approach to terrorism," the leaders stressed the need to dismantle terror infrastructure, disrupt terrorism fi

15 Indians killed in Vietnam boat capsizes

HANOI, JUL 11: Fifteen Indian tourists were killed after the speedboat they were travelling in capsized off Vietnam's Phu Quoc Island on Saturday, the Indian Embassy in Hanoi said.

There were 36 people on board, including 32 Indian tourists and four local crew members, of which 21 were rescued.

Phu Quoc, Vietnam's largest island, is a major tourist destination, known for its white-sand beaches, coral reefs and island-hopping excursions. The tourists in this case were reportedly returning from

SIA secures RCN against HM terrorist

Future wars will still be won by military power, not just AI: Def Min

VISAKHAPATNAM, JUL 11: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh today said that 'future wars may be fought with Artificial Intelligence, but they will still be won by national resolve, trained soldiers and robust military power'.

"Andhra Pradesh has emerged as a new powerhouse of India's defence and aerospace manufacturing," he said while speaking at the commissioning ceremony of INS Mahendragiri here.

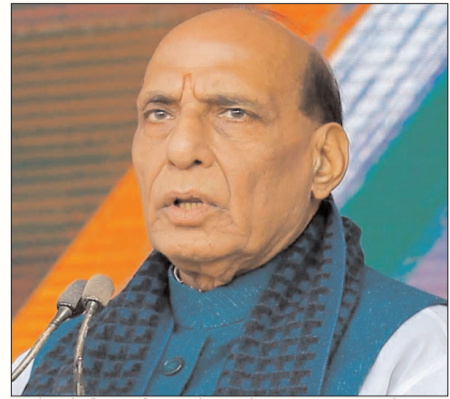
Highlighting the government's balanced approach towards defence modernisation, Singh said India was investing in next-generation technologies while simultaneously strengthening conventional military capabilities.

He cited Operation Sindoor as an example of the effective integration of conventional and modern capabilities to safeguard national security.

"Future wars may be fought with Artificial Intelligence, but they will still be won by national resolve, trained soldiers and the capable military power. So, I would say that new technologies and conventional platforms are not opposed to each other, but supplement each other, complete each other. Without conventional platforms, new technologies are incomplete in themselves," he said.

According to Singh, it is certain that new technologies have reshaped warfare, but they have not diminished the role of conventional warfare means.

The strong conventional capability that is still necessary for the fulfilment of basic



principles of war is as important as it was before.

Emphasising that maritime security and economic security are closely interconnected, Singh said the seas remain vital for trade, supply chains, energy security and economic growth.

He reaffirmed the government's commitment to the Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR) vision in the Indo-Pacific.

Calling India a net security provider and trusted regional partner, Singh said the Indian Navy has consistently demonstrated its commitment through humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations, anti-piracy missions and the evacuation of Indian and foreign nationals from conflict-ridden regions, earning recognition as both a first responder and a preferred security partner.

Fresh batch of 9,182 pilgrims leaves for Amarnathji cave shrine

The 10th batch of 9,182 pilgrims, including women & children, left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here today to pay obeisance at the holy Amarnath cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas.

The pilgrims included 2,435 women, 256 sadhus, 46 sadhvis and 31 children. They left for the twin base camps of Nunwan in Anantnag district and Baltal in Ganderbal district in separate convoys under tight security arrange-

ments in the early hours, officials said.

While 5,877 pilgrims headed for the Pahalgam base camp in a convoy of 206 vehicles, 3,305 pilgrims onboard 127 vehicles left for the Baltal route, officials said.

Over two lakh pilgrims have so far visited the shrine this year.

Officials have repeatedly announced that only registered pilgrims would be permitted to proceed to Kashmir, while unregistered devotees would be stopped at designated checkpoints until fresh registration quotas become

available.

The 57-day pilgrimage to the cave shrine was officially flagged off by LG Manoj Sinha on July 2 morning from Bhagwati Nagar base camp here simultaneously for the traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam route in Anantnag district and the shorter but steeper 14-km Baltal route in Ganderbal district. The yatra will conclude on August 28.

Authorities have put in place multi-layered security arrangements along the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway and at all

Heavy rains likely in J&K, neighbouring states

IMD issues weather warning

NEW DELHI, JUL 11: The India Meteorological Department (IMD), in its All-India Weather Summary and Forecast Bulletin issued today, has forecast an active monsoon spell over northwest India, including J&K, during the next six days.

The weather office has warned of heavy rainfall over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi, while thunderstorms, lightning and gusty

winds are expected across parts of central and eastern India.

According to the IMD, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi are likely to witness isolated to scattered rainfall from July 11 to July 16. The intensity of rainfall is expected to increase during the first three days, with isolated heavy rainfall likely between July 11 and July 13. The weather conditions could trigger waterlogging in low-lying areas, traffic congestion and localised flooding, particu-

larly in urban centres.

For Jammu & Kashmir, the weather office has forecast fairly widespread to widespread rainfall on July 11 and 12. Thereafter, rainfall activity is expected to reduce slightly, with isolated to scattered showers likely from July 13 to July 16. Heavy rainfall is likely at isolated places on July 11 and 12, particularly in hilly areas.

Punjab is also expected to remain under the influence of an active monsoon sys
