Wedding Reports Remain Unconfirmed

According to Telly Talk India, Jennifer reportedly married Singapore-based businessman William Ishmael in a private ceremony attended by close friends and family. The wedding is said to have taken place in the UK on July 16.

However, neither Jennifer nor William has publicly acknowledged the marriage. No official pictures, statement or announcement have been shared by the couple so far. For now, the reports remain unverified despite the bridal footage fuelling speculation online.

Jennifer and William are said to have been together for several months while keeping their relationship away from public scrutiny. Earlier reports claimed that William proposed during a holiday, after which preparations for the wedding began. The couple has not spoken about how they met or when their relationship started.

Who Is William Ishmael?

William is reportedly based in Singapore and works as Director of Business Development and Trading at MHC Digital Group. He studied Economics and Finance at the University of York and has previously worked with UBS Investment Bank.

His professional background includes trading, foreign exchange and business development.

Unlike Jennifer, William has largely stayed outside the entertainment spotlight.

As speculation continues, the gown videos have become the most visible clue linked to the reported ceremony. Until Jennifer or William addresses the matter, however, the wedding remains a claim rather than a confirmed development.

Janhvi Kapoor Moves On After Peddi Row, Signs Next Film With Pagglait Director

Janhvi Kapoor is on a roll. A month after Peddi row, the actress has signed her next big film with Pagglait director Umesh Bist. This will be their first collaboration ever. Meanwhile, Janhvi has still not reacted to the controversy regarding Peddi where a section of netizens bashed the portrayal of her character, Achiyamma, accusing the makers of objectifying her.

According to Variety India, Janhvi Kapoor's project is untitled as of now. It will be backed by Ekta Kapoor's Balaji Motion Pictures and Guneet Monga's Sikhya Entertainment. The cast and crew will start shooting around October-November this year. There is no additional information yet regarding the storyline, genre and cast.

On the other hand, Umesh Bist will also be busy directing Pagglait 2 alternatively. It is the sequel to the 2021 Netflix film and Sanya Malhotra is expected to reprise her lead role as Sandhya. The second part will carry the story forward.

Meanwhile, Janhvi Kapoor's role in Peddi had sparked a major debate over the objectification of women in commercial cinema.

Following the backlash, director Buchi Babu Sana apologised and removed the controversial scenes



from the film.

The winners of the 72nd National Awards were declared today at the National Media Centre in New Delhi. Article 370 emerged as one of the biggest winners, taking home Best Feature Film and securing the Best Actress honour for Yami Gautam Dhar. The film is directed by Aditya Suhas Jambhale, who co-directed it along with Aditya Dhar.

Speaking exclusively to News18 Showsha, Priya Mani Raj, who plays PMO Joint Secretary Rajeshwari Swaminathan in Article 370, shares her excitement and says, "I'm very fortunate to be a part of such an important film. I'm so glad it won multiple National Awards including Best Film." She's equally elated that her co-star Yami won the Best Actress Award.

"I've seen Yami's talent and hard work in person. I'm extremely happy for her and the entire team," she says. For the unversed, in the film, Yami essays the role of intelligence officer Zooni Haksar. Her character drives the film's security operation-narrative as political and administrative developments unfold in parallel in the national capital.

Article 370 was producer by Jyoti Deshpande, Aditya Dhar and Lokesh Dhar under Jio Studios and B62 Studios. The cast also included actors like Arun Govil, Kiran Karmarkar, Vaibhav Tatwawadi, Raj Arjun, Skand Thakur and Divya Seth Shah. Made on a budget of Rs 20 crore, the film earned Rs 110 crore at the box office and emerged as a hit.

Article 370 however led some sections of the internet to describe it as propaganda. Speaking to us earlier, the director had said, "It's long run in theatres validates the point that the narrative of it being a propaganda film – as it was being referred to before release – was completely wrong... I never thought about making a



statement. The film made a statement on its own."

Coming back to the 72nd National Awards, Rajkumar Rao-starrer Srikanth was named Best Hindi Feature Film, while Kartik Aaryan received his first National Award, sharing the Best Actor trophy with Malayalam superstar Mammootty. Kartik was recognised for Chandu Champion, while Mammootty won for Bramayugam.

Filmmaker Rajkumar Periasamy was honoured with the Best Director award for Amaran. Meanwhile, Kalki 2898 AD won the award for Popular Film Providing Wholesome Entertainment, and Randeep Hooda took home the Best Debut Director award for Swatantrya Veer Savarkar.

After Sonam Wangchuk's Hospitalisation, Dia Mirza Extends Support To Student Protesters: 'I Hear You'

Dia Mirza has publicly extended support to education reformer and climate activist Sonam Wangchuk, as concern around his prolonged hunger strike and the wider student protest continues to grow. Sharing a statement on Instagram, the actor said she stood with students demanding accountability, transparency and changes in India's education system.

The post also named fellow hunger strikers Neha, Ameen and Manish, placing the focus not only on Wangchuk but also on the young protesters who have remained at the centre of the agitation.

In the text shared on her Instagram account, Dia wrote, "I stand with the students of this nation. I support the right to peaceful protest." She further backed demands for "accountability, transparency and reforms" in education and said she stood with Wangchuk, Neha, Ameen and Manish.

Her caption carried a direct message to the protesters: "I hear you, I see you, I stand by you." Dia added that she supported Wangchuk's call for dialogue and his right to continue protesting.

The actor did not attach her support to a party or political organisation. Her statement remained centred on students, due process and the need for those in authority to respond through conversation.

Wangchuk Moved To Hospital On Day 21

Dia's post comes at a critical point in the protest. Wangchuk began his indefinite fast at Delhi's Jantar Mantar on June 28 over alleged examination paper leaks, demands for education reform and calls for Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan's resignation.

On July 18, Delhi Police moved him to VMMC and Safdarjung Hospital on the 21st day of his fast, citing medical concerns. Reports said Wangchuk objected to being taken away, while organisers described the move as forced.



Before his hospitalisation, medical updates had shown significant weight loss and worsening health indicators. The Delhi High Court had also directed the authorities to monitor his condition regularly and permit medical intervention based on doctors' assessment.

The agitation has not ended with Wangchuk's removal from the site. CJP founder Abhijeet Dipke announced that he would begin an indefinite hunger strike, while plans for a peaceful march towards Parliament on July 20 remained in place.

Neha, Ameen and Manish have also been fasting alongside Wangchuk. Organisers identified them as student activists and said each had suffered considerable weight loss during the protest.
