

Actress Ayesha Khan detained during Mumbai protest, questions police action



Actress Ayesha Khan was taken into police custody on Wednesday, while standing on a road in the city's Dadar area during a demonstration held in solidarity with student protests over the NEET paper leak controversy, according to videos she shared on Instagram. Khan, known for her role in "Dhurandhar," said

she had not been part of the protest itself and was only present because her brother and male friends had already been detained. "I have been detained in the police van just for standing on the road peacefully," she said in one clip.

In a separate video recorded after she was moved to Worli Police Station, Khan questioned the grounds for her detention, asking why she had been picked up when she had neither raised slogans nor spoken to anyone at the spot. She also noted that four policewomen were required to place her in the van. SouthAsians & Diaspora

Other young protesters detained alongside her raised similar concerns. One student said in a video that missing a scheduled exam because of the detention would create serious problems for him.

The detentions come amid a wider wave of student-led demonstrations across Delhi and Mumbai tied to mismanagement of the NEET-UG examination process. Several Bollywood figures, including Sonakshi Sinha and Hrithik Roshan, have publicly backed the student protesters and criticised police conduct at demonstration sites in recent days.

Mumbai Police have not issued an official statement on Khan's detention or the circumstances surrounding it as of Wednesday evening.

Priyanka Chopra's mother Madhu Chopra shares her weekend mehendi hack to keep hair soft and nourished

Dr Madhu demonstrated how a simple oil blend stops henna from drying out her hair, calling it part of a haircare system she has followed for years.

Dr Madhu Chopra, mother of actor Priyanka Chopra Jonas, shared her weekend haircare ritual on Instagram, revealing how she keeps her hair soft even after using mehendi, which typically leaves strands feeling dry.

In the video, her hair is coated in mehendi paste that has been left to dry for about an hour. She then with some help applies a blend of Adiwasi oil mixed with castor oil and rosemary oil directly over the dried henna. Dr Chopra explained that this oil combination stops the mehendi from drying out her hair further, working into the shaft and roots to keep it soft and nourished once washed off.

She said she plans to leave the oil on for another thirty minutes before rinsing, allowing it to fully moisturise her hair without affecting her scalp.

For Dr Chopra, this mehendi hack isn't a standalone fix but part of a larger routine she has refined over time. The 73-year-old, who has spent more than 40 years working in healthcare, treats it as one piece of a broader weekly system rather than a one-off trick.

In the latest video, Dr Chopra signs off with her hair still wrapped up in the mehendi and oil mix, promising to follow up once it's washed out to show the results.

Thea Donaldson, formerly Thea Booysen, married YouTuber Jimmy Donaldson, known globally as MrBeast, in a private ceremony on Necker Island in July 2026.

Thea Booysen is a South African content creator who uses the name "TheaBeasty" on YouTube and Twitch. She began her streaming journey in 2016, sharing gaming content centred around games like The Witcher 3 and Gwent. Over the years, she expanded her presence beyond streaming, establishing herself as an esports commentator and gaming personality with a distinct following of her own, well before her marriage to MrBeast.

Thea Booysen studied law and psychology at Stellenbosch University in South Africa before earning a master's degree in human cognitive neuropsychology from the University of Edinburgh. Beyond her online work, she made her debut as an author, publishing a book The Marked Children in 2022, that added another dimension to her public profile.

Booyesen and Donaldson first met in 2022 during his trip to South Africa, her home country. What followed was a largely long-distance relationship as the two built their connection across continents before she eventually relocated. Donaldson proposed on Christmas Day 2024 with a solitaire diamond ring estimated to be worth upward of \$250,000, as per Keyzer Jewellery, in a moment surrounded by both their families.

Following the wedding, Booysen officially changed her name from Thea Booysen to Thea Donaldson, a shift she also reflected across her social media presence. The ceremony itself was attended by roughly 70 close friends and family after a week-long celebration. For the vows, groom donned a Ralph Lauren tuxedo, while the bride wore a custom mermaid-cut gown by Nicole + Felicia Couture.



Kaylee Hottle, deaf 'Godzilla' actor, killed in car crash at 18

Young actor, known for playing 'Jia' in 'Godzilla vs. Kong' and 'Godzilla x Kong: The New Empire', was killed after a car veered off the road; investigation is under way.

Kaylee Hottle, a deaf actor best known for her starring role in two "Godzilla" films, died in a car crash in Maryland early Tuesday morning, the Frederick County Sheriff's Office said. She was 18.

Hottle was one of two passengers in the car when it went off the road and hit a culvert in Ijamsville before 3 am. The driver was taken to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries, and the other passenger declined medical treatment, according to a news release from the sheriff's office.

Excessive speed is believed to be a factor in the crash, which is under investigation, the sheriff's office said.

Hottle was a native signer of American Sign Language, and her family members are also deaf. Her parents, Joshua and Ketsi Hottle, shared emotional video statements about her death on social media sites.

"Kaylee's mom and four siblings are crushed," her father said in ASL in a post from an airport. "They are together at home, grieving. I am on my way to Maryland to bring Kaylee's body back home." Hottle's heart stopped before she arrived at a hospital, transported by air from the scene of the accident, her father said. "Very grateful for the 18 years we had together - and wish we had more," he said.

Joshua Hottle also reached out to the driver, described by the sheriff's office as a 19-year-old man.

"I have forgiven you," her father said. "Don't let this incident ruin the rest of your life." "I still feel Kaylee is with us," her mother said in ASL in a post.

In "Godzilla vs. Kong" and the sequel, "Godzilla x Kong: The New Empire", Hottle played an orphaned girl named Jia who sees beyond Kong's threatening appearance and forms a special bond with the mon-



ster, communicating with him using sign language.

"I'm so devastated to hear this. You will be deeply missed Kaylee," her "Godzilla" co-star Millie Bobby Brown posted on Instagram.

Co-star Alexander Skarsgard, who learned ASL to communicate with Hottle, told the pop culture website Junkee in 2021 that he and others were impressed by the young ingenue's professionalism and her ability to quickly incorporate the director's notes into her acting.
