J&K Bank strengthens CSR outreach with Project SAMARTH, support for CRC Srinagar

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Reinforcing its commitment to inclusive growth and social responsibility, J&K Bank on Thursday organised a mega distribution camp under its flagship CSR initiative Project SAMARTH and handed over a dedicated transport vehicle to the Composite Regional Centre (CRC), Srinagar.

The programme was presided over by the Bank's Executive Director, Sudhir Gupta, in the presence of Deputy General Manager Syed Adil Bashir, ALIMCO Head (North Zone) S.K. Tripathi, CRC Srinagar Director Dr. Behzad Maqbool, senior Bank officials and representatives of ALIMCO and CRC.

During the camp, customised assistive aids and appliances worth ₹46 lakh were distributed among more than 400 beneficiaries. Under Project SAMARTH, the Bank has so far facilitated the distribution of assistive devices to over 4,700 persons with disabilities and senior citizens from economically weaker sections, with a major focus on Jammu and

Kashmir.

Addressing the gathering, Executive Director Sudhir Gupta said J&K Bank views Corporate Social Responsibility as an extension of its philosophy of socially empowering banking.

He said the initiative aims to enhance the independence, dignity and mobility of persons with disabilities by providing customised assistive devices that improve their access to education, employment and community life.

Implemented by the Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Project SAMARTH covers five districts of Jammu and Kashmir besides Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Bengaluru.

ALIMCO Head (North Zone) S.K. Tripathi said the project, with a financial outlay of ₹383.38 lakh, reflects J&K Bank's proactive CSR approach and has helped extend the benefits

of assistive technology to those who need it most.

On the occasion, the Bank also handed over a dedicated transport vehicle to CRC Srinagar, similar to the support earlier provided to CRC Jammu. Thanking the Bank for its continued CSR support, CRC Srinagar Director Dr. Behzad Maqbool said the vehicle would strengthen rehabilitation and outreach services, particularly for persons with disabilities living in remote areas of the Kashmir region.

DC Doda visits Pul Doda, assesses situation following rainfall

DC Udhampur reviews TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyan progress in district

Deputy Commissioner Udhampur Minga Sherpa today chaired a meeting with Health Department officers to review the progress of the TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyan.

Chief Medical Officer Udhampur Dr Anil Manhas and District Tuberculosis Officer Dr Anil Saloch presented the district's performance, covering tuberculosis detection, treatment outcomes, screening coverage, Ni-Kshay Mitra registrations and other key indicators.

The Deputy Commissioner directed the Health

Department to expand TB testing, strengthen diagnostic facilities and ensure timely identification and treatment of patients. He called for enhanced coun-

selling services, greater involvement of frontline health workers in identifying suspected cases and uninterrupted follow-up. He also directed intensified

awareness campaigns at the grassroots level and stronger inter-departmental coordination to achieve 100 per cent screening coverage.

Deputy Commissioner Udhampur Minga Sherpa today chaired a meeting with officers, empanelled vendors and representatives of agencies associated with the PM Surya Ghar Mukh Bijli Yojana to assess the scheme's progress.

Executive Engineer JPDCL presented a status report covering applications received, vendor allotments, pending cases and solar panel installations completed so far.

The DC directed JPDCL and empanelled vendors to bridge the gap between applications received and

DC Udhampur reviews I-Day arrangements

Deputy Commissioner Udhampur Minga Sherpa today convened a meeting of district officers to discuss arrangements for the Independence Day 2026 celebration at the district headquarters.

The main function will be held at Government PG Degree College (Boys). Discussions covered seating, barricading, security, traffic, drinking water, power supply, sanitation, first aid, the public address system and transport.

Executive Engineers of PWD, PHE and PDD were

directed to ensure seating, barricading, drinking water and uninterrupted power supply. Chief Executive Officer, Municipality, was asked to maintain cleanliness, and Chief Medical Officer to deploy an ambulance with doctors

and medicines. District and Traffic Police would handle security and traffic management. Separate committees were constituted for the celebration.

Among those present were Additional District Development Commis-

sioner Jugal Kishore, Additional Deputy Commissioner Prem Singh, General Manager DIC Kishore Singh Katoch, Assistant Commissioner Revenue Dr Umesh Shan, Chief Planning Officer Uttam Singh and other district officers.

DC Reasi reviews measures for removal of National Highway encroachments

REASI, JULY 23: Deputy Commissioner Reasi Kumar Abhishek today chaired a meeting to review implementation of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India regarding removal of unauthorised encroachments from National Highways.

The Deputy Commissioner directed

to conduct a comprehensive survey of National Highway stretches within their respective jurisdictions, identify all unauthorised encroachments and initiate removal in accordance with prescribed legal procedures.

The Revenue Department, NHAI, PWD and other agencies concerned were instructed to work in close co-

ordination for prompt implementation.

The DC emphasised strict compliance with the Hon'ble Supreme Court's directions to ensure road safety, maintain the Right of Way (ROW) along National Highways and prevent unauthorised encroachments that pose risks to commuters.

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In the aftermath of recent flash floods and landslides, Deputy Commissioner Poonch, Sh. Ashok Kumar Sharma, today inspected various water pumping stations to assess the damage and review the status of drinking water supply.

During the visit, the Deputy Commissioner thoroughly inspected the functioning of the pumping stations and took stock of the water supply arrange-

ments. He reviewed the impact of the recent natural calamity on the water supply infrastructure and interacted with the concerned officials regarding the restoration and maintenance of the system.

The DC directed the concerned Executive Engineer and officials of the Jal Shakti Department to take immediate measures for the restoration and smooth functioning of all affected pumping stations.

The Deputy Commissioner also visited the riverbed, where he in-

spected the protection bund damaged during the flash floods and assessed the condition of other flash flood-affected sites in the district.

He directed the concerned authorities to take prompt measures for the restoration and strengthening of the damaged protection infrastructure and ensure timely action at vulnerable locations.

During the visit, the Deputy Commissioner also interacted with the local public and listened to their issues and concerns. He as-

sured them that their genuine problems would be addressed on priority and that all possible support would be extended by the district administration for relief, restoration and rehabilitation in the affected areas.

Additional Deputy Commissioner Poonch, Tahir Mustafa Malik; ACR, Muhammad Sayeed; XEN JPDCL, Aftab Ahmed; CEO Municipality, Khalil Ahmed Bandy and other concerned officers accompanied the Deputy Commissioner during the visit.

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
