

ADC Billawar Reviews Development Works, Directs Swift Restoration of Rain-Affected Infrastructure

BILLAWAR, AUGUST 19: Additional Deputy Commissioner Billawar, Vishavjeet Singh, today chaired a meeting at the PWD Guest House, Billawar, to review the progress of departmental works, implementation of schemes and achievement of targets besides taking stock of the situation arising from recent rains.

During the meeting, the ADC directed the AEE, PHE, to submit a detailed damage assessment report of water supply infrastructure affected by the rains, along with details of mea-

PMGSY and PWD authorities to ensure immediate restoration of all roads closed due to the recent rains. He also stressed removal of bushes and vegetation along roads to improve visibility and prevent mishaps.

The ADC further directed BRO authorities to clear the sludge accumulated on Dhar road, which has been hampering the movement of small vehicles.

The TSO Billawar was asked to ensure regular and uninterrupted supply of ration to far-flung areas of the sub-division, particularly in view of the weather conditions, so that the public does not face any inconvenience.

The BMO briefed the meeting on the progress of the TB Mukti Bharat Campaign and ongoing activities, while BDOs apprised the ADC of their respective plans under the Viksit Bharat-Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (VB-G RAM G).

The ADC directed all concerned officers to maintain close coordination, ensure timely execution of development activities and promptly address public grievances, with special focus on areas affected by the recent rains.

Former corporators protest outside JMC office, seek resolution of civic issues

Former corporators staged a protest demonstration outside the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) office on Wednesday, raising several issues concerning civic amenities and problems being faced by residents across Jammu.

A memorandum highlighting various demands was submitted to JMC Commissioner Dr Devansh Yadav. The Commissioner gave a patient hearing to the former corporators and directed the concerned officers to take immediate necessary action on the issues raised by former corporator Gaurav Chopra and others.

Speaking on the occasion, the former corporators said that Union Home Minister Amit Shah had visited Jammu and Kashmir following the devastating floods of August 26, 2025, to take stock of the situation. They said funds under the SACS scheme had subsequently been allocated to Jammu and



Kashmir, but alleged that the funds were being utilised for construction and improvement of lanes that had already been metalled or tiled, instead of prioritising areas that were actually damaged by the floods.

They alleged that several of the worst-affected wards had been ignored and expressed concern over the alleged diversion of funds towards other schemes. The former corporators demanded a transparent review of the utilisation of the funds and priority to areas

that suffered extensive damage.

Several other issues were also discussed with the JMC Commissioner, including pending sewerage works, damaged structures requiring urgent repairs, sanitation-related problems, issues concerning helpers attached to auto services and transfers of supervisors.

The former corporators also highlighted the large-scale sewerage problems being faced in different parts of Jammu, particularly the sewerage issue along Shamshan Ghat

Road, Gorkha Nagar. The Commissioner directed the concerned officers to take necessary action for resolving the problem.

The alleged diversion of funds in various wards was also discussed, following which the Joint Commissioner (Works) was directed to examine the matter on priority.

Those who participated in the protest included former corporators Sham Lal Basson, Amit Gupta, Inder Singh Sudan, Rashpal Bhardwaj, Mohi-ud-Din, Anita Sharma, Ghar Singh and Sobit Ali.

drains, while an individual requested the release of one year's pending vehicle rent from the SE Hydraulics Department. A student sought assistance regarding admission to Government Women College, Gandhi Nagar, and a woman from Qasim Nagar requested immediate police intervention in an alleged molestation case.

Sat Sharma, speaking on the occasion, said that BJP has always believed that public service is the highest responsibility of a political organization. The Principal of Govt. Degree College Bishnah invites 'Expression of Interest' for Empanelment of reputed book publishers / Suppliers / Vendors for the procurement /supply of books to the college for the financial year 2026-27.

The eligibility criteria, terms and condition to be followed by interested parties are as under:

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA
Proof of the following mentioned supporting documents must be enclosed in support of the eligibility criteria and absence of any of them will render the vendor/supplier's ineligible for empanelment:

1. Book Publisher/Supplier/Vendors must be a regular service provider to at least one premium government institute of Jammu & Kashmir UT for Higher Education.
2. Registration of Federation of Publishers' and Booksellers' Association in India (FPBAI).
3. Permanent Account No (PAN) issued by the Income Tax Department.
4. Evidence of Income Tax clearance certificate of least three consecutive years.
5. Book sellers should be sole proprietorship Certificate.

Note: The applicant should read all terms and conditions properly before submitting the application for empanelment.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The applications received after the due date and time will not be considered by the college.
2. All the pages of empanelment documents are to be signed and stamped by the firm along with the application.
3. The application must be submitted along with CDR of Rs.10, 000/- (ten thousand) as security deposit drawn from any Jammu and Kashmir Bank Ltd. in favor of Principal, Govt. Degree College, Bishnah and Security deposit will be returned to the Supplier after the expiry of the empanelment period. However, in case unsatisfactory performance during the empanelment period, security deposit will be forfeited.
4. The college reserves the right to reject or accept any offer without assigning any reason or cancel or withdraw the notice.

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

You are required to adhere to the below mentioned terms and conditions:

1. **Discount:** The supplier/Vendor is expected to extend a maximum discount on all types of books. In case, the rate of discount varies then the highest discount offered will be applicable to all the eligible book suppliers/vendors. However, if any one disagrees the firm can be withdrawn from the empanelment.
2. **Conversion Rates:** The supplier should submit necessary supporting document/s Good Office Committee (GOC) conversion rates for foreign books.
3. **Editions of Books:** Only latest editions shall be supplied.
4. **Order Acknowledge:** The order should be acknowledged within 15 days from the date of order.
5. **Paperback / Hardback:** If paperback edition is not available, then consult library/beforehand if you intend to supply hardback editions.
6. **Book Supply Time:** The maximum time limit for supplying Indian books is 15 days and foreign books are 30 days.
7. **Black Listing Vendor:** In case of non-supply of books within the stipulated time for successively three times, the vendor will be removed from the empanelment and blacklisted for future supply, unless the vendor communicates the reason for the delay in supply with valid proof.
8. **Order Cancel:** Order would be treated as cancelled, if the books are not supplied or no report as to availability or otherwise is received within this period.
9. **Price Proof:** The supplier shall provide "Publisher's Price Proof / Publisher's Catalogue" along with the supply of books in support of the price not printed on books.
10. **Transportation Charges:** Books must be supplied to the Library with No Transportation charges and No other/extra charges are admissible.
11. **Payment:** The final payment shall be made in Indian Rupees within STIPULATED TIME from date of receipt of the invoice, Through Online Mode in favor of your agency as per your invoice/s. The Final Invoice/s in triplicate shall be submitted alongwith a Photocopy of your agency's PAN card /GST details /Bank account details for the payment.
