Anupam Kher 'Horrificed' By The Devastation, Sonu Sood Promises Help



Nepal is reeling from devastating flash floods that have left several people dead and more than 1,600 still missing. The disaster is one of the deadliest to strike Nepal in recent years. Several Bollywood celebrities have taken to social media to express grief and stand in solidarity with those affected by the flash floods.

Sonu Sood was among the first to offer help. Known for stepping in during times of crisis, the actor said he was ready to help with food and shelter and support efforts to rebuild affected communities. Meanwhile, Anupam Kher shared a video message expressing his shock and sadness over the devastation. Nepal-born actress Manisha Koirala, Sanjay Dutt, Kangana Ranaut and others also reacted to the tragedy.

Sonu Sood took to his social media

handle to reacted to the tragedy. "Nepal, you are not alone. We are coming with food, shelter and the strength to help you rebuild," he wrote.

Meanwhile, Sanjay Dutt expressed solidarity with those affected by the floods. "My thoughts and prayers are with everyone affected by the floods in Nepal. I stand with you in this difficult time and will always be there to support you in whatever way I can. Stay safe and stay strong," he wrote.

Nepal-born actress Manisha Koirala also reacted to the tragedy, urging people to keep the country and those affected by the disaster in their prayers. She shared a simple message that read, "Pray For Nepal."

Kangana Ranaut also reacted to

the tragedy by resharing a video of Sadhguru reporting that 80 members of the Isha Foundation were missing after the Nepal-Tibet flash floods. The actress wrote, "Terribly sorry for the tragedy and the loss."

Anupam Kher shared a video message, expressing his shock and heartbreak over the devastation caused. "I PRAY FOR NEPAL! Deeply saddened and horrified by the devastation caused by the sudden floods in Nepal. Lives lost. Families torn apart. Homes washed away. Helpless animals caught in the destruction. It is heartbreaking to imagine how, in a few moments, everything someone calls their own can disappear. Watching these scenes, I feel such helplessness. What words can possibly comfort someone who has lost a loved one?" he wrote in the caption.

Mukesh Khanna Declined Cheques Worth Crores, Says Ranveer Singh Can Play 'Kilwish But Not Shaktimaan'

Mukesh Khanna has long spoken about his superhero character Shaktimaan. The series was adapted into a film, and since then, discussions about Ranveer Singh playing the lead have made headlines. However, Mukesh Khanna has strongly opposed the choice and insisted that people like Singh and Shah Rukh Khan cannot convincingly play the role.

Now, in a recent interview with Subhojit Ghosh, Mukesh Khanna has reacted to the trolls and said, "Why should I move on? I have made Shaktimaan," and revealed that he had been offered the role of Kilwish (antagonist), but he was adamant about playing the lead.

"I sent him away from here after listening to him because he was very, very interested in Shaktimaan. I mean, he sat here for three hours and tried very hard to convince me. And I was even feeling guilty that I was turning him down, because I just couldn't see the kind of face I wanted for Shaktimaan in him. He was so energetic that during those three hours, he sat here and told his whole story. He sat down on the floor. Aditya Chopra came from behind. I was... and suddenly, I was amazed. I have never seen a more energetic man than him. After Dev Anand saab, this is the one actor I have seen with so much energy. He just cannot sit still. If he sits here, he'll go there; from there, he'll jump onto the table; then he'll go somewhere else," Mukesh Khanna said.

Revealing how he has rejected cheques worth crores, Khanna said, "No doubt, com-



mercially, I am behaving like a stupid person. I have held back a cheque worth crores, not lakhs, crores. People in my own office told me, 'Sir, take the cheque. You can fight later.' I said, 'Keep quiet. Don't talk about this.' I told them to wait. I said, 'I don't want to do it.' Money does not come before principles. I said, 'Suppose I take the money, and then there is drama over it?' I haven't taken it, because my second cheque was about to come, and I stopped it. I had taken the first one, but I stopped the second cheque. I said, 'I had told you that you would make Shaktimaan only after consulting me.' Now they have put in a con-



dition saying, 'No, sir, we will consult you, but we will do things our own way.' I said, 'That is not done. Tomorrow, you'll show him dancing in a disco. Tomorrow, you'll make him do something else...'"

"So I have to preserve Shaktimaan's legacy. Commercially, yes, it may be a very stupid decision. People say, 'Go ahead, man. He's such a big actor, he can do it. Actors can do anything.' People have told me many times, 'Sir, if he can do Dhurandhar, he's a big actor. He can do it. Why don't you believe it?' I can see that desperation in the audience and viewers," concluded Mukesh Khanna.

Rakul Preet Singh On What Drew Her To Surpanakha In Ramayana: 'She Was The Most Beautiful Woman Of Lanka'

Rakul Preet Singh says her role as Surpanakha in Ramayana: Part 1 gave her the chance to explore a side of Ravana's sister that she had never come across before. The actress, who is awaiting the release of the epic film, found the character interesting because of the layers written into her story.

Rather than looking at Surpanakha only through her familiar image as an antagonist, Rakul says that she was drawn to the possibility of understanding her as a more layered character. She said the role allowed her to approach Surpanakha from an actor's perspective and explore different sides of her personality.

Talking about her part in the film, the actress said, "Every few years, you see a different interpretation and presentation of these characters, while keeping the essence rooted in the original text. As an actor, you only look at a character from that lens, that it's a character that has layers, that has the possibility and ability to shine through the film. She was apparently the most beautiful woman of Lanka. As an



actor, it's fun to explore those layers".

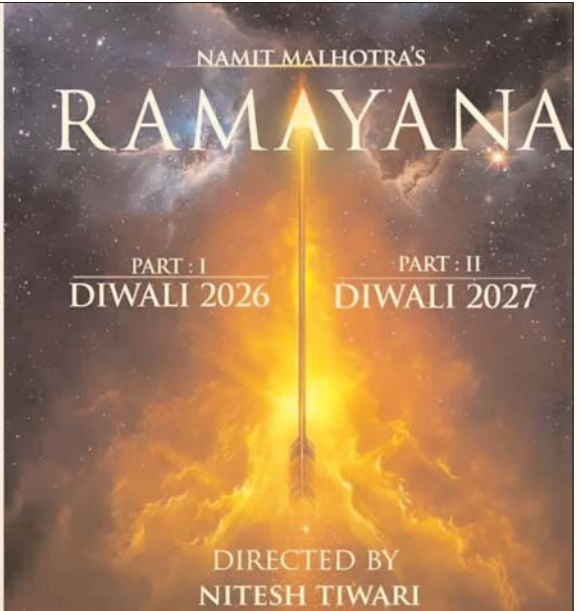
The script also introduced Rakul to parts of Surpanakha's life that she was not previously familiar with.

She further mentioned, "There was a lot about her that I didn't know. When I read the script, there was a lot about her life before and after that incident where her nose is chopped off by

Rakul also pointed to the parts of Surpanakha's journey that take place before and after that incident. The actress said the script explores how Surpanakha meets Ram and what happens in her life beyond the episode that is most commonly associated with her character.

"What happens in life and how does she meet, stumble upon



Ram—there's a lot which I didn't know, which for me was new when I read the script, and which is why I liked it", she added.

Ramayana: Part 1 features Ranbir Kapoor as Ram, Sai Pallavi, Ravie Dubey, Yash and Sunny Deol alongside Rakul. The film is set to arrive in cinemas on November 6, 2026, bringing this interpretation of the epic to the big screen.
