

NC Gheraoes BJP Headquarters, Demands Immediate Restoration of Statehood to J&K

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The Jammu and Kashmir National Conference today strongly protested and gheraoed the BJP Headquarters at Trikuta Nagar, Jammu, demanding the immediate restoration of full Statehood to Jammu and Kashmir under the chairmanship of Advocate Rattan Lal Gupta Provincial President J&K National Conference Jammu.

Addressing the protesters, Ajay Kumar Sadhotra former minister and Additional General Secretary said that the restoration of Statehood is the democratic and constitutional right of the people of Jammu and Kashmir. He reminded the BJP-led Central Government of the commitments repeatedly made by the Prime Minister and the Union Home Minister, both inside and outside Parliament, regarding restoration of Statehood.Sadhotra said that the people of J&K have been waiting for the fulfilment of this solemn commitment. He stressed that the Centre must not further delay the restoration of Statehood and should immediately bring the necessary legislation before Parliament.He further said that the Supreme Court has also directed the Union Government to take steps towards restoration of Statehood, and therefore there is no justification for keeping the people of Jammu and Kashmir .

Addressing the protesters, Advocate Rattan Lal Gupta Provincial President Jammu said that the main



objective of today's gherao, BJP Party headquarter, Trikuta Nagar Jammu was to send a clear message to the BJP that the people of Jammu and Kashmir will continue to raise their voice democratically until full Statehood is restored.

Gupta said that the Centre must respect the decisive mandate given by the people of Jammu and Kashmir to the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference and the Omar Abdullah-led Government. The popular mandate must be honoured in the true spirit of democracy and federalism.

He asserted that Statehood is essential for effective governance, accountability, inclusive development and protection of the democratic aspirations of the people of J&K. The National Conference will continue its peaceful democratic struggle until the legitimate demand for restoration of Statehood is fulfilled, Mr Gupta.

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JKPCC Chief Shri Tariq Hameed Karra questioned the double standards of BJP for remaining silent on core issue of restoration of statehood, stating that BJP's hypocrisy is exposed over its protest today after having failed on public issues during 12 years of double engine system of BJP.

Addressing a gathering of congress workers at Kathua to felicitate the newly appointed office bearers of the DCC and BCCs in the district JKPCC Chief hit out at BJP for betrayal on the issue of restoration of statehood and questioned the criminal silence of 29 BJP legislators and other top BJP leaders after getting people's mandate on this core issue of people of J&K and said that BJP has himself exposed by today's protest over issues, which BJP failed to address during 12 years of double engine Govt. of BJP at Centre and in UT.

He said that BJP owes an answer to their commitment of restoration of statehood immediately after Assembly elections but even after two years of an elected government taking over, the BJP leaders are maintaining



criminal silence over the issue of restoration of statehood.

Karra said that BJP promised a lot to the youth of J&K at the time of abrogation of special status and downgrading of the historical state in 2019 but failed to deliver on those promises and now trying to divert the attention of the people especially youth who are facing record unemployment apart from paper leaks and recruitment scams under UT rule. He said that congress stands for accountability of the system but BJP has to start from its own house. The people are sandwiched between two power centers in the absence of statehood for which Centre government and BJP is squarely responsible and answerable

to the people of J&K.

DC Srinagar reviews progress on AgriStack, Farmer ID Generation and Digital Crop Survey

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Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Akshay Labroo, today chaired a meeting of senior Revenue Officers at the Conference Hall of the DC Office to review the progress on the implementation of AgriStack, Farmer ID generation and the Digital Crop Survey across the District.

The meeting was attended by Additional Deputy Commissioner Srinagar Mir Imtiyaz Ul Aziz, Additional Deputy Commissioner Aadil Fareed, SDM West Irfan Bahadur, SDM East Zubair Ahmad,

Assistant Commissioner Revenue Umar Gulzar, all Tehsildars, District Manager, CSC and other concerned.

During the meeting, the DC took a detailed review of the progress achieved under the initiatives and assessed the status of farmer enrolment, generation of Farmer IDs and the ongoing Digital Crop Survey across all the Tehsils of the District.

On the occasion, the DC directed all concerned Revenue Officers to accord top priority to the enrolment of eligible beneficiary farmers and ensure that the process is completed in a time-bound manner. He

stressed the need for coordinated efforts at the Tehsil and field levels to ensure that no eligible farmer is left out of the enrolment process.

The Tehsildars were directed to closely monitor the progress in their respective jurisdictions and complete the enrolment process of farmer-related data.

Emphasizing the importance of reliable data, the DC stressed that the exercise should be carried out with due diligence so that the database remains. The DC also called for close co-ordination between the Revenue Agriculture Departments and CSC func-

tionaries involved in the process.

During the meeting, the DC also took stock of various revenue-related initiatives, including status of digitisation of Revenue Records, Online/Offline Migrant Grievance and other citizen centric revenue-related service. He stressed the importance of efficient, transparent and citizen-centric delivery of revenue services across the district.

The DC directed all concerned Officers to maintain regular monitoring of progress and ensure effective implementation of all ongoing revenue and farmer-centric initiatives.
