

'Kalki 2898 AD' Makers Warn Against Fake Casting Calls: 'Do Not Make Any Payments'



The makers of director Nag Ashwin's magnum opus 'Kalki 2898 AD', on Thursday issued a statement, cautioning the public to be aware of fake casting calls and individuals who were falsely claiming to represent them. Well known production house Vyjayanthi Movies, which is producing the immensely popular franchise featuring a number of top stars including Prabhas, Amitabh Bachchan and Kamal Haasan, took to its social media timelines to share a statement in this regard.

It shared the statement, saying, "Important Clarification: Please beware of fake casting calls and individuals falsely claiming to represent #VyjayanthiMovies. #Kalki2898AD."

In its statement, the production house said, "Vyjayanthi movies

would like to clarify that we are not associated with, nor have we authorised, any third-party agency, company, individual, or casting representative to conduct auditions or casting on our behalf."

The production house urged people not to share their details with any such persons or agencies. It wrote, "Please do not share personal information, audition material, or make any payments to anyone claiming to represent us."

Vyjayanthi Movies pointed out that it reserved all rights to take appropriate legal action against any unauthorised use or misrepresentation of its name. "For authentic information, please rely only on Vyjayanthi Movies' official social media handles."

It may be recalled that the first

part of Nag Ashwin's magnum opus 'Kalki 2898 AD', which had emerged a huge blockbuster, had won two National awards at the 72nd National Film Awards, announced by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.

Stating that they were deeply honoured and grateful to receive the two National Awards that had been awarded to their film, the makers of the film had said that awards like these inspired them to keep dreaming bigger, tell stories that resonated across generations, and take Indian cinema to even greater heights.

At the awards, Nag Ashwin's 'Kalki 2898 AD' won in two categories. The film won the Best Popular Film Providing Wholesome Entertainment Award and the Award for Best Production Designer.

Sajid Nadiadwala To Shoot Sequel Of Akshay Kumar Starrer In Australia



Heyy Babyy 2 has been officially announced, and will be filmed extensively in Australia. Sajid Nadiadwala's production house, Nadiadwala Grandson Entertainment, has announced a three-film deal to shoot its upcoming projects in Australia, with the much-awaited sequel to the 2007 comedy Heyy Babyy among them. For the unversed, Heyy Babyy, directed by Sajid Khan, starred Akshay Kumar, Fardeen Khan, Riteish Deshmukh, Vidya Balan and others.

The announcement was made on Thursday, September 3, during New South Wales Premier Chris Minns' visit to Nadiadwala Grandson Entertainment's Mumbai office.

The Australia connection is par-

ticularly significant for Heyy Babyy 2, as the original Heyy Babyy was also filmed in Australia. The sequel will therefore take the franchise back to a country that was part of the first film's production nearly two decades ago.

While details about the sequel's storyline and cast are yet to be revealed, its inclusion in the three-film deal confirms that Australia will once again serve as a filming destination for the franchise.

The announcement comes as part of a larger collaboration between Nadiadwala Grandson Entertainment and Australia through Sydney based TEMPLE, with the production house set to take three of its upcoming films to the country.

NSW Premier Chris Minns, who is in India from August 31 to September 3, visited the Nadiadwala Grandson Entertainment office in Mumbai as part of his India visit. During his time at the production house, the Premier toured the office and engaged with the team, with the visit culminating in the announcement of the three-film Australia deal.

Released in 2007, Heyy Babyy is a comedy-drama directed by Sajid Khan and produced by Sajid Nadiadwala. The film stars Akshay Kumar, Riteish Deshmukh and Fardeen Khan as three bachelors whose lives change after a baby is left at their doorstep. The film was extensively shot in Australia.

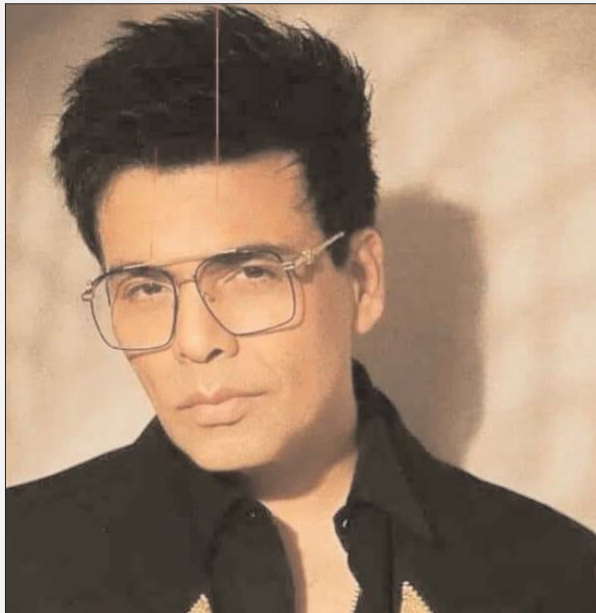
Karan Johar To Bring Radha Krishna's Divine Love Story To Big Screen, Sachin Ravi To Direct: Report

Karan Johar is reportedly preparing to enter the historical-devotional space with a film centred on the story of Radha and Krishna. After decades of producing and directing films largely rooted in romance, family drama and contemporary relationships, the filmmaker is now looking towards Indian scriptures for one of Dharma Productions' most ambitious projects.

According to a Pinkvilla report, the film has been titled Radha Krishna and is currently in an advanced stage of development. Filmmaker Sachin Ravi has reportedly been brought on board to write and direct the project. The cast, however, remains under wraps.

A source close to the development claimed that Karan had been keen to bring the story of Radha and Krishna to cinema for a long time but was waiting for the right screenplay.

"Karan Johar has been wanting to make a film on Radha Krishna for the longest time, and he has finally found a script that does justice to one of the biggest and most iconic love stories from



the Indian scriptures. The film is being written and directed by Sachin Ravi for Dharma Productions, and it is in the advanced stages of development at the moment," the source was quoted as saying.

The project is expected to be mounted on a large scale, with its makers planning an expansive visual treatment for the story. At



the same time, the film will reportedly retain romance, emotion, drama and tragedy as its principal ingredients.

While Radha Krishna will place the relationship between Radha and Krishna at its emotional centre, its narrative is expected to cover a wider portion of Krishna's life.

"The film will chronicle the jour-

ney from Krishna's birth to the killing of Kansa, but at the core of it is the divine love story of Radha and Krishna," the source added.

Further details about the screenplay and the film's interpretation of the story have not been revealed. Dharma Productions has also not announced the actors being considered to play Radha and Krishna.

Samay Raina Roasts Varun Dhawan, Mimics His Trademark Smile On India's Got Latent 2

Varun Dhawan is stepping into the unpredictable world of India's Got Latent Season 2, and judging by the first promo, the actor has no intention of sitting quietly on the panel.
