Ameesha has now hit back at the netizen with a sarcastic response, taking a dig at the user for linking the casual gesture to romance.

Karan Johar Remembers Dad Yash Johar, Recalls His Final Days In Emotional Post



Karan Johar remembered his late father, filmmaker and producer Yash Johar, on his birth anniversary with an emotional note. Alongside a series of rare family photographs, Karan spoke about the warmth and affection his father brought into his life. He also revisited some of their most personal moments, including the difficult days Yash Johar spent battling cancer and the emotional conversation they shared after one of his chemotherapy sessions.

Among the memories Karan shared was an amusing story from the time Kuch Kuch Hota Hai had released. Celebrating the success of the film, Karan decided to buy himself his first designer jacket from Burberry. He recalled proudly wearing the jacket home, only for his father to question his choice.

"I wore it and in my head I was

looking rather smashing (the origin of my delusion). My father looked at me perplexed and asked, "Beta...yeh kya hai...?" With pride, as if I had conquered Bond Street itself – I said "Papa yeh Burberry hai!" He took a deep Punjabi breath and said "Beta yeh Burberry nahi...Bahut buri hai..." I was shattered and then almost immediately burst out laughing! That was my father – rooted, basic and very very funny..."

He Was My Biggest Fan', Says Karan Johar

Karan remembered his father as someone who never stopped encouraging him. Even when he was struggling with his weight, his dad would reassure him that it was only 'puppy fat' and would eventually go away.

Karan recalled that his father would often tell him that he was handsome enough to become a hero

and even encouraged him to learn horse riding.

KJo remembered Yash Johar as a man defined by kindness, humility and selflessness, describing him as his hero. After a chemotherapy session, his father expressed his fear that he might not have much time left and asked Karan to make him a promise.

Yash Johar, the founder of Dharma Productions, died in Mumbai on June 26, 2004, aged 74, due to a chest infection, while also battling cancer. Having established the production house in 1976, he played an influential role in Hindi cinema and backed several notable films during his career, such as Kuch Kuch Hota Hai and Kabhi Khushi Kabhie Gham among others.

Manoj Bajpayee Begins Shoot As Mahatma Gandhi For Sudhir Mishra's Next In Lucknow

Manoj Bajpayee is all set for his next project now. He will be playing the role of Mahatma Gandhi for the first time in his career in national Award-winning filmmaker Sudhir Mishra's upcoming feature film. The film, titled Gandhi and My Mother, will explore a crucial 21-day period around India's Independence, focusing on Gandhi's choices and actions as the country navigated a defining moment in its history.

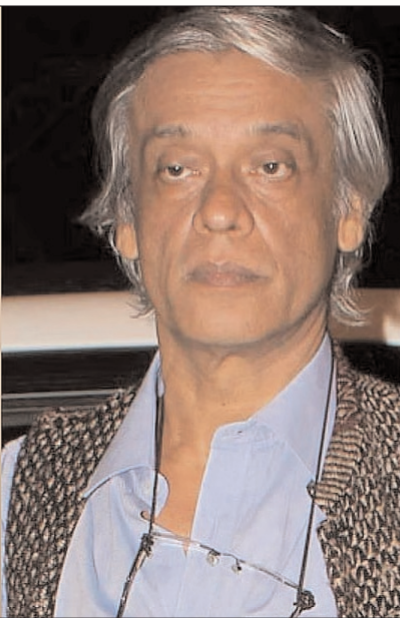
According to the latest report by Hindustan Times, Sudhir Mishra's film has officially gone on floors now. The cast has started shooting an outdoor sequence in Lucknow. The cast of the film also includes Divya Dutta and Saurabh Shukla.

The film's Lucknow schedule began in the Narhi area near the Lucknow Zoo, where the team shot a sequence involving a young girl and one of Gandhi's public movements. The makers have also paid close attention to the period details, recreating the 1940s through vintage cars, costumes and old-style signboards to give the setting an authentic



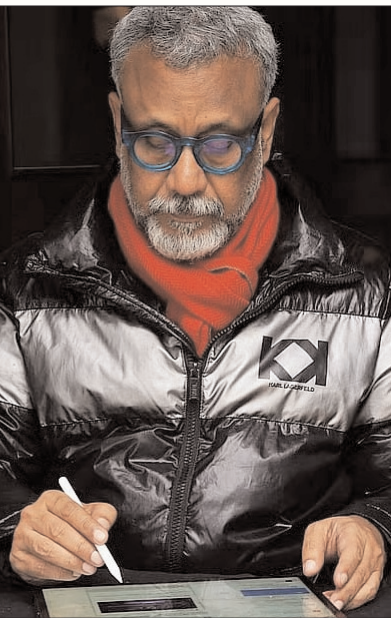
feel.

The director had earlier told HT City, "My mother (Durga Devendra Nath Mishra) had met Gandhi as a child and we have had long discussions with her about him. Before she passed away (in 2022), I made a promise to her that I will make a film on him. So, I wrote this script that deals with a chapter from the later stage of



his life. Anubhav (Sinha, director-producer) has backed me."

Anubhav Sinha, founder of Benaras Mediaworks, is backing Mishra once again after their collaboration on Afwaah in 2023. He also opened up about the film and its production. "Manoj has lost considerable weight for the film and is currently in the 'Gandhi zone' on a restricted diet and a par-



ticular lifestyle. The film's shoot will continue till October in Lucknow. All we can share is that it's about a 21-day chapter from Gandhi's life. We just have a working title for now and we are working on a new title," he said.

Further details about the supporting cast, filming schedule and theatrical release date are yet to be announced.
